

HEADRICK HITS AT HIGH TARIFF

Does Not Help Labor, Says
Congressional Candidate.

"High tariff does not help labor," asserted William D. Headrick, candidate for Congress from the Seventh District, in a talk Monday night at Fountain Square. Headrick, who is recovering from an eight weeks' illness, was obliged to rest upon a chair while he spoke.

"Some of the lowest wage scales to be found in the country are those in certain New England industries that have the highest tariff protection," said Headrick. "The hardships that the tariff works for the farmer are readily apparent."

"If the President seek legislation which I am convinced will make for the good of the country, I shall give it my support. Otherwise I shall oppose it."

Compares City With Con-
ditions in Canton, Ohio.

Crooked politicians, crooked news papers and crooked lawyers are just as much a part of the underworld as gangsters and thugs, Napoleon Hill, Canton, Ohio, told an audience at Cadle Tabernacle Monday night. Hill was closely associated with Don Mellett, murdered in a drive to rid Canton of vice.

The lecture here was the first of a series of three on the subject "Why Don Mellett Was Murdered." The second is to be tonight. The speaker was introduced by the Rev. George S. Henninger, pastor of East Tenth Street Methodist church.

"Churches frequently are sub-
sided," Hill declared, and added that he was "thoroughly convinced that things in Indianapolis and other cities are just as bad as Canton."

market. Cucumbers are still plentiful
and are selling at 40 cents a
dozen.

String beans have reduced to
15 cents a pound or two pounds for
25 cents. Other prices were un-
changed. I da hatoes were selling
at 5 cents a pound; Jersey sweet
potatoes, three pounds for 25 cents;
Michigan Concord grapes, 35 cents
a basket; Cuban pineapples, 50 cents
each; asparagus, 50 cents a bunch;
Indiana Delicious apples, 10 cents a
pound; Indiana persimmons, 25 cents
a pint; turnips and radishes, 20
cents a pound; turnips and radishes,
5 cents a bunch; tomatoes, 10 cents
a pound, and strawberries, 60 cents
a quart.

sold at 40 cents a pound; springers,
40 and 45 cents a pound; ducks,
50 cents a pound; squabs, 75 cents
