BOOZE CASE SETTLED

Wabash Smoked Up Over Tobacco Issue

CRAWFORDSVILLE, Ind., Nov. 22.—The question of tobacco has become one of the major issues of the year in discussion at Wabash College.

It has long been a tradition at the school that no student or instructor shall be permitted to smoke on the college campus.

The "Bachelor" official school paper, has started a campaign to do away with this old rule and nearly every student at Wabash is taking sides in the argument.

Students now take their daily smoke just outside the campus and the "Bachelor" claims that inasmuch as no written rule denies students

the right to use tobacco on the campus, the old tradition should be discarded.

Those in favor of retention of the no-smoking idea claim that Wabash's position was founded upon such traditions and rules and for that reason as many as possible should be kept sacred.

The student government council has taken no definite stand with either side.
