JOLIET, Ill., Nov. 22.—An investigation to determine whether prisoners in Joliet penitentiary are receiving a regular supply of liquor began here today as the result of the arrest of Peter Kelly, a former guard who was taken into custody outside the walls as, officers said, he was delivering a bottle of moonshine whisky to a trustee.

Warden Elmer J. Green, who ordered the investigation, said that Kelly had been dismissed from State service several months ago when he was found carrying contraband articles inside the prison.

Kelly's arrest was made by three guards who said they witnessed the transfer of the whisky.
