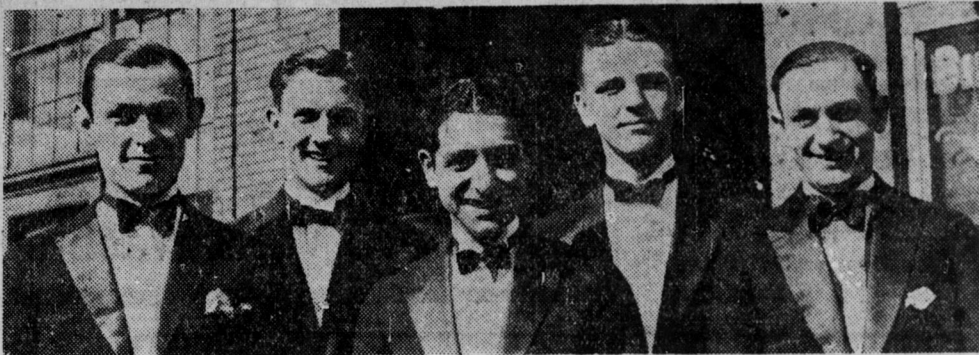

MEXICO SUBJECT AT OPEN FORUM

Citizens to Give Views on U. S. Stand Monday.

The Indiana Council on International Relations will give Indianapolis citizens an opportunity to express their views on the Mexican situation at 7:30 p. m., Monday night, at the Spink Arms.

Dr. Alvah W. Taylor, who headed a party of Americans, who recently studied Mexican conditions will speak on "Has America a Case Against Mexico?"

Mrs. W. S. Lockhart, executive secretary, declared the session is to discuss whether the attitude of the United States toward Mexico is justified.

Rabbi J. Marshall, Terre Haute, who returned from a tour of Mexico in January, will speak. Dr. Howard Jensen and Dean J. W. Putnam of Butler University, who were in Taylor's party will lead the discussion.

Members would be selected by educational groups, composed of county superintendents, school trustees and teachers.
