Wire news today carried the story of Johnny Farrell's record-breaking tour of the second nine at the Delaware Country Club course, Muncie, where Johnny and Tommy Armour played an exhibition Thursday. Tommy and Johnny are to play at Highland here Monday in a special Labor day treat for Indianapolis golf enthusiasts.

Farrell, holder of a number of major tournament titles this year, scored a 32 on the incoming nine at the Muncie course, four under par. His 40 going out gave him a total of 72, exactly par. Armour, national and Canadian open champ, had a 74.

At Highland, Monday, they will meet Neal McInyre and Freddie McDermott. Fred and Neal are two of Hoosierdom's outstanding links experts and some real golf should be uncovered.
