

NEW PAVEMENT IS OPENED ON STATE ROADS

Run-arounds Are Removed on Several Routes, Bulletin Says.

Several miles of new bituminous pavement was opened on Rd. 29, near Burlington; new concrete on U. S. 41, near Morocco and bridge detours and run-arounds were removed on Rd. 3, near Muncie; 27 miles of Ft. Wayne; 53 miles of De-motte; 32 near Dover, and 56 near Cato and East Enterprise.

These were the high lights of the weekly traffic bulletin issued today by the State highway department. Indianapolis roads were given as follows:

No. 29 (Madison, Greensburg, Shelbyville, Indianapolis, Logansport, La Porte, junction of Rd. 29 near Michigan City) Detour about construction just south of Greensburg; one mile is very narrow. Run-around at one and one-half miles north of Kirklin. Bridge run-around at 10 miles Detour from junction of Rd. 30 and 31, pavilion bridge run-around at two miles north of junction of Rd. 30 and 31.

U. S. No. 31 (Louisville, Seymour, Columbus, Indianapolis, Peru, South Bend, Michigan line) Five-mile detour around Edinburg bridge is narrow. Bridge run-
