## STATE ORDERS INSANE MOVED

Congestion at City Hospital  
Will Be Relieved.

Reapportionment of State insane patients to permit all at the Central State Hospital here to have a bed for the first time in months will begin today, when 75 persons from the local institution will be taken on special coaches to the Evansville hospital.

Crowded conditions have forced 72 Central patients to sleep on the

floor, Dr. Max Bahr, superintendent, said.

Patients from four Indiana counties will be removed Wednesday and later Hancock and Hendricks county patients will be removed to the Madison hospital, Dr. Bahr said.

Eleven attaches of Central will accompany the train. Arrangements have been made to board the coaches at the hospital's railroad siding here and detrain within the Evansville hospital grounds.

The trip will be in the nature of an outing for the patients, Dr. Bahr said, with smokes and "eats" provided en route.
