

ELVADOR GIVES GREAT OVATION TO LINDBERGH

Thousands Welcome Air Ace; Honduras Is Goal on Next Hop.

SAN SALVADOR, Salvador, Jan. 2.—Charles A. Lindbergh, who literally has conquered this little mountain city, today was to face another round of social affairs scheduled for the second day of his visit here.

The young air hero was to be the guest of honor at a luncheon by the American charge d'affaires. Later he was to attend a tea-dance in his honor at the country club, where he was to be presented with the keys to the city by the mayor. Ever since the flashing monoplane The Spirit of St. Louis settled gracefully at the Sitio del Nino field yesterday, after its trip from Belize, British Honduras, the pilot has been the center of festivities.

Thousands at Field

Yesterday the city was thronged with thousands of people long before Lindbergh was to land. At 9:05 a.m. his plane appeared over the field, circled it three times and settled down ten minutes later. He was one hour ahead of his scheduled arrival time.

He was rescued from the crowds and taken to the presidential mansion, where was greeted by President Romero Bosque, members of the cabinet, the diplomatic corps and others prominent in the republic.

"I want to tell you all I would like to stay here for weeks instead of two days," Lindbergh told the people of San Salvador. "But I have promised I would attend the Pan-American conference in Havana, and to arrive there in time I find it advisable to shorten my stay in each of the Central American countries."

Senoritas Get Smiles

Salvador's señoritas were out en masse to see "Lindy," but they received the same treatment as thousands of other girls—merely that famous Lindbergh smile which has become so characteristic.

Lindbergh intended to complete his round of social duties today and planned to hop off early tomorrow for Tegucigalpa, Honduras.
