



M'ADOO ATTACK REASONS BARED

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—"Al" Smith's failure to follow William Gibbs McAdoo's example of withdrawing from the Democratic presidential race is responsible for McAdoo's renewal of his campaign against the New York Governor's wet views.

That was the explanation given today by M. O. Dunning, collector of customs at Savannah, Ga., and one of McAdoo's closest friends.

"McAdoo," said Dunning, "very gracefully retired to give Smith opportunity to do likewise. But Smith did not want harmony that bad and he's still in the race."

Repudiating reports that the South was preparing to accept Smith's nomination at "Houston and harmony" convention, Dunning snorted.
