

## WALSH DEFEAT ON POWER QUIZ ROUSES PARTY

Democrats Object to Lobby  
Influence; Robinson Is  
Criticised.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 21.—Democratic Senators who deserted Senator Walsh to vote against a Senate investigation of the power industry have not heard the last of it, party leaders agree.

Breaking of party ranks in such a manner as to give an impression that Democrats are under the thumb of the power lobby does not set well with the rank and file of the party.

The most surprising desertion was that of Senator Joseph Robinson of Arkansas, minority leader in the Senate. Had Robinson stood by Walsh, the power resolution would have carried. Walsh concedes this. Robinson not only added strength to Senator George's attack on the Walsh resolution, but carried other Democratic votes with him.

Reasons for Split


Numerous reasons are being advanced for what happened. Here are a few:

Robinson and George wanted to prevent Walsh from becoming too outstanding a national figure and opposed his power inquiry in order to set him back politically.

The Democrats wanted to get campaign funds from the power interests.

The Democrats wanted to punish Walsh for playing a "lone hand."

Robinson Blamed

The greatest fault being found with Robinson is that he failed as party leader to take steps to prevent what happened. Instead of softening the blow, or saving the party's face, Robinson let Walsh go to defeat on the Senate floor.

Walsh was notified that Robinson intended to vote against his resolution and that George intended to introduce the amendment sending the investigation to the Federal Trade Commission.

This notification came only a few days before the vote was taken and no effort was made to work out a compromise.

"It is just what I wanted," Mrs. Grimes said, but her husband thought otherwise and had the baby turned over to police.

The red-haired baby was born to an unwed Decatur girl at a sanitarium here where Mrs. Grimes had left an order that the next baby boy be reserved for her.

## CHALLENGE TO LAW HURLED IN CHICAGO BLAST

### Bomb Wrecks Home of State's Attorney Kin; Reward Offered.

CHICAGO, Feb. 21.—Turning from their alleged intimidation of city officials, Chicago's bombers today answered attacks from the State's attorney's office with a heavy charge of dynamite, planted at the home of the brother-in-law of State's Attorney Robert E. Crowe.

The explosion, the fourth which has been directed at political figures in the present bombing series, occurred at the residence of Lawrence Cuneo.

No one was injured, but other residents of the building in which Cuneo lives said that glass and chinaware were broken by the concussion.

The bomb shattered the outer doorway and ripped away part of one wall of the apartment building. A general exodus of tenants of nearby buildings followed.

Crowe's office recently began a concerted movement to end the wholesale bombings which were inaugurated recently. The blast was considered a direct challenge to this movement.

Crowe said: "If they're after me, it's an attack on the Crowe political organization."

Crowe immediately offered a \$10,000 reward and immunity to any person who will reveal the identity of the bombers.

### FOOTE IS NOMINATED

Named by Coolidge to Succeed to  
Thurman's Post.

George L. Foote, acting collector of internal revenue for Indiana, has been nominated by resident Coolidge as collector to succeed M. Bert Thurman, according to Washington dispatches.

Thurman was given a one month leave of absence preliminary to resigning March 15 to manage the campaign of Senator James E. Watson for the Republican presidential nomination.

Foote, who came here from New Albany, served seven years as assistant deputy and chief deputy.
