

## U. S. SOON MUST BUY BRITON OIL, OBSERVERS SAY

Foreign Students See Early End of Supply and Lost Independence.

**WASHINGTON.** Feb. 23.—Like the poet's raven, foreign students of the international oil situation perch above our door, watching the United States as it drains its oil reserves and at the same time begins to try to conserve its supply and invade foreign fields for future resources.

Most of these persons believe that our petroleum supply will soon be so inadequate that foreign oil interests, will be able to extort high prices from us for their oil and gasoline and that the American Navy, because American oil supplies are so concentrated, never will be able to launch an attack outside American waters.

England Controls Market

Most frequently quoted of all are the utterances of Sir Mackay Edgar, the British banker.

"The time is in sight when the United States will be nearing the end of some of the available stocks of raw materials on which its industrial supremacy has been largely built.

America must soon depend on British companies for oil. Americans already are diligently scouring the world for new oil fields—only to find almost wherever they turn, that the control of all the most promising properties is in British hands.

"With the exception of Mexico and, to a lesser extent, Central America.

U. S. Will Have to Buy Oil

"We hold in our hands the secure control of the future of the world's oil supply. To the tune of many millions of pounds a year, America soon will have to purchase from British companies."

Edgar exaggerated. Standard Oil is in a better position today than when he spoke. But several government officials have found food for thought in what he wrote. "The case as he presents it, finds support to an alarming extent," said David White, former chief geologist of the Geological Survey.

Anton Mohr, author and lecturer on political geography at Oslo University, is Norwegian and hence regarded as a neutral.

He declares that practically everything Edgar said was true.

## THIN GLASS OPERATES TO CLEAN WINDSHIELD

Motorist's Home-Made Device Noted at Evansville

EVANSVILLE, Ind., Feb. 23.—A Michigan motorist who visited Evansville recently carried his own remedy for cleaning the windshield of his car.

Anyone can apply the accessory in a short time and decrease chances of accidents caused by a frosty windshield.

All one needs is a piece of glass thinner than the windshield which is stuck on the inside of the shield with adhesive tape.

A strip of tape is first put over the edges of the piece of glass so the two are not in direct contact. A second set of strips hold the thin glass in place and also close cracks. The space between insulates the area covered and in this manner prevents sleet and snow from sticking to the outer glass.

Doors and windows may also be treated in this manner, insuring clear vision in all directions. It is advisable to use small squares of thin glass.
