Mayor L. Ert Slack in a speech of welcome and commendation at 9 tonight officially will open the Indianapolis pure food and household appliance show at the Cadle Tabernacle.

Doors will be open to the public at and the seventy-five manufacturers and distributors will greet the visitors with beautifully decorated booths in the first food and household appliance show in this city in five years.

Monday has been dedicated to city employees and The Indianapolis Times and Indianapolis Star. Before and after Mayor Slack's speech, clowns, comedians and singers will frolic on the stage and throughout the building. The Cadle Tabernacle organist will give a musical program during the evening.

The Tuesday program will be given over to the Retail Grocers' and Meat Dealers' Association, Inc., of Marion County. Every grocer's wife will be given flowers. Doors will open at 1 p. m. and close at 10:30 p. m. The same hours will be observed the remainder of the week.

The baby show opens at 1:30 p. m. under the direction of C. A. Bell, member of the executive board. Babies up to 7 months will be judged by a staff of physicians in a specially constructed glass house in the Tabernacle.


