

JEWETT RAPS STEVE IN TALK AT FRANKLIN

Opens Stump Campaign for
Republican Nomination
for Governor.

FRANKLIN, Ind., March 9.—Charles W. Jewett, candidate for the Republican nomination for Governor, flayed Stephensism and asserted himself as an independent candidate, in his opening campaign address here Thursday night.

This is Jewett's home and he spoke in the courthouse where, he said, he first "conceived his ambition to become a lawyer."

Opened Attack in 1925

"In 1925 when D. C. Stephenson, former Klan dragon, was at the height of his power and influence, in public address, I denounced him in the strongest language at my command as the most dangerous, unscrupulous, dishonest leader that had ever appeared on our political horizon."

It is easy now and takes little courage for men in public life to stand before people and to wage warfare against Stephensism in Indiana when the leader is behind prison bars and his vicious teeth have been drawn."

Tragedy of Rule

Jewett said it was "a tragedy that Stephenson had his office in Indianapolis" and that he possessed the machinery of the Marion County political organization and commanded the rank and file of the Democratic party."

"Stephenson and his lieutenants, in order to preserve their strength, have filled the State administration with party workers to the detriment of the other counties," he continued.

"In this campaign I shall not deviate from my convictions and the record I have made. I have never compromised with my convictions and shall not do so now. I am not a candidate of any group or faction."

CAMPBELL RUNS AGAIN FOR COUNTY ENGINEER

Advocates Hard Roads as Present
Day Necessity.

County Engineer Henry R. Campbell, a Republican, today announced his candidacy for re-nomination.

A county road program of hard surfaced roads only is advocated in his platform. "Due to the weight and speed of motor traffic and the number of vehicles using Marion County highways I believe that it will not be economical to construct or maintain anything but hard-surfaced roads," he said.

"Improved roads are no longer a luxury but an absolute necessity." His adoption of open printed specifications giving fair competition in all materials likely to be used in county highway construction, was pointed out in the announcement.

WAR IN ARABIA LAID TO TRIBAL RELIGIOUS ZEAL

Spread of Moslem Crusade
Unlikely, Yet Situation
Regarded Grave.

CAIRO, March 9.—The powerful sheik Ed Dowish, restless from long inactivity, is responsible for the holy war in Arabia and has forced Ibn Saud, king of Hedjaz, into the field, according to British sources here.

These sources said today the complications in Arabia were due primarily to the religious fanaticism of the Wahabi tribe and the belief that it has a divine mission—to convert the world to Mohammedanism.

Wahabis Unpopular

As long as Ibn Saud was victorious in battle, it was pointed out, he was able to concentrate their energies

and hold them in check, but as soon as it became necessary to settle down and consolidate the Wahabi conquests, it became difficult to restrain the fanatics.

The Wahabis are unpopular in the rest of the Islamic world because of their iconoclastic, fierce puritanism, hence British sources believe that spread of the Islamic movement to other Moslem countries is unlikely. Yet, the situation is difficult of prediction.

If the Wahabi movement gathers strength by advancing irresistibly under capable leadership and is unopposed by a disciplined army, it is considered here that the movement will be stopped only by the impossibility of finding supplies to feed such a huge force.

Possibilities Grave

If a big force advances on Baghdad, airplanes will have an impossible task and a grave situation will develop. This applies also to Transjordan, where experience has shown a big army, without warning, may reach within striking distance of Amman.

British experts here consider it doubtful whether a counter offensive is possible because of desert conditions.

Moreover, it is to Great Britain's interest to settle amicably, especially as commercial projects between

Iraq and Haifa cannot be constructed without Ibn Saud, ruler of Nejd. The projects would have to pass through the Iraq-Transjordan corridor which is at the mercy of the Wahabi.
