

Fishing The Air

CONSIDERED by prominent radio engineers as the greatest and most revolutionary achievement in the perfection of broadcast receiving apparatus, an automatic radio receiver has been perfected after years of research and was demonstrated last week by Harry N. Marvin, retired millionaire inventor of automatic devices, at his country home at Rye, N. Y. The first public demonstration of this new automatic development which may make the present type set obsolete will be made at the Radio World's Fair at Madison Square Garden in September.

Marvin's invention demonstrated that dials can be eliminated from all future radio receiving sets. Instead of the tiresome tuning and turning of one or more dials, now essential when any particular station is required, all that a person need do is press a button on the front of the set and it will be automatically tuned in on the wave length desired.

A new half hour entertainment will go on the air over WFBM beginning tonight at 7 under the sponsorship of the Farns Ice Cream Company. The company is celebrating its golden anniversary this year, and will present during these half-hour programs the Golden Anniversary Jubilee Quartet, a well-known male quartet of colored harmonists specializing in plantation melodies and Negro spirituals.
