

# RIDDLE WOMAN, OF CARNATION MYSTERY, DIES

End Comes for Patient After Life Fight Lasting 31 Hours.

WASHINGTON, March 23.—The "carnation woman" lay dead today on the same marble slab in the city morgue where for thirty-one hours rescue squads applied artificial respiration to save her.

She was identified today as Mrs. May Josephine True.

A sister, Mrs. Rosie Felda of Al-tamont, Md., made the identification.

She said Mrs. True's husband died in a West Virginia mine accident twelve years ago and that the widow subsequently fell in love with John Hollins, a Baltimore man.

This man, she said, transferred his affections to another, after giving Mrs. True the white carnation which she clutched in her hand when found.

The woman, found presumably "dead" from chloroform on a train from New York Tuesday morning, was brought back to life but never to consciousness by pulmotor and blood transfusion. Her will to die prevailed, however, at 4 p. m. Thursday, and the coroner prepared to bury her with the crushed white carnation she held in her hand when discovered.

Mrs. True's father, Francis Robie, was in a hilly section of West Virginia, snowbound and beyond telephone reach.

## TRUCK LICENSE CLASH IMPENDS

State Drivers Protest City Permit Law.

Plans for a test case to secure a State Supreme Court decision on legality of forcing out-of-town truck operators to pay Indianapolis city truck license will be made at a meeting of truck operators and representatives of Indianapolis firms April 3.

Protest over arrest of several out-of-town truck drivers recently was made at a meeting of the Motor Truck Association of Indiana Thursday at the Chamber of Commerce.

Tom Snyder, secretary, declared truck operators already pay the city through the State gasoline tax, and that they pay a State truck license and personal property tax. A city truck license, he said, is double taxation.

Representatives of the stockyards and other firms dependent on articles hauled here in independent trucks will attend the meeting April 3.

Snyder said Thursday enforcement of the ordinance would result in truck operators going on strike and refusing to bring livestock, milk and other articles to Indianapolis, seriously crippling local industries.

### MYERS ASSAILS G. O. P.

Democratic Candidate Denounces State Corruption.

LA GRANGE, Ind., March 23.—Taking as his "text" Governor Jackson's recent utterance, "The Republican party in Indiana comes to the voters this year with less to apologize for than before; we will have an unequalled record to take to the voters," Walter Myers, candidate for the Democratic nomination for United States Senator, scored corruption here Thursday night.

Addressing a Democratic dinner meeting, Myers recounted the indictment of public officials under the last four years of Republican rule and declared, "The record is unequalled indeed; unequalled in infamy, unequalled in crime, disgrace and shame."

Albert Stump, rival candidate for the senatorial nomination, also scored Republican leadership.

### STOLEN CAR BURNED

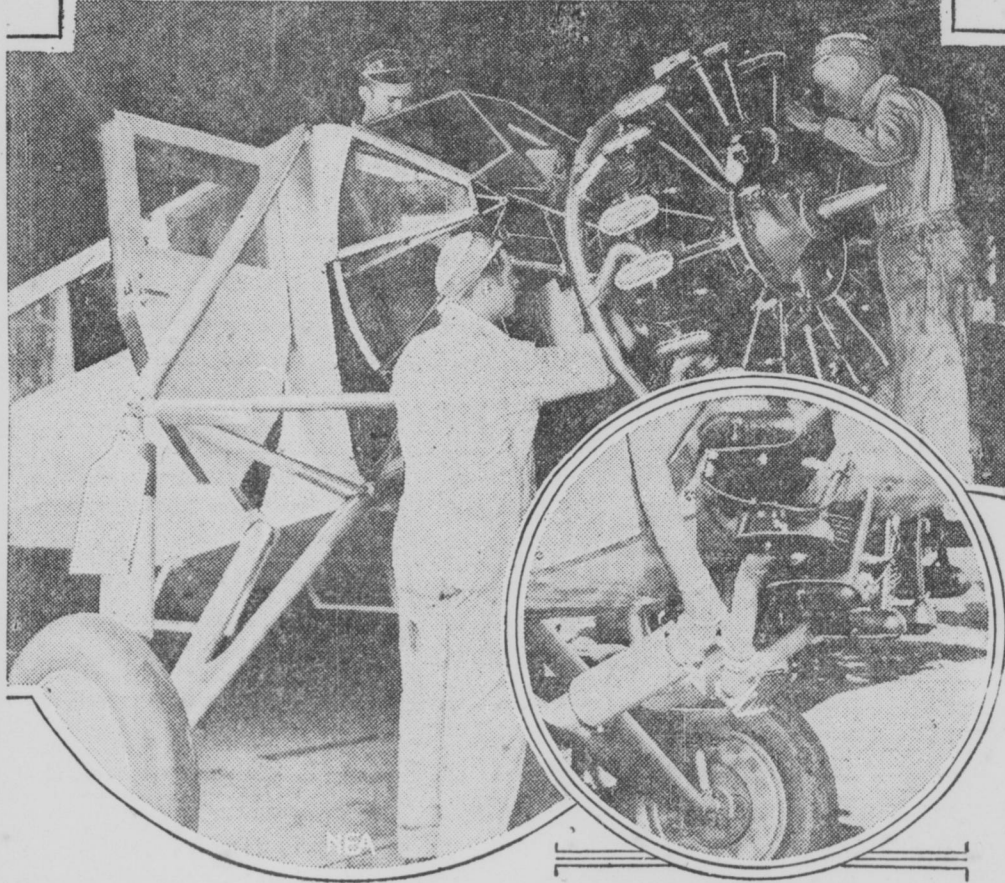
Ruins of Lost Auto Found Near Railroad.

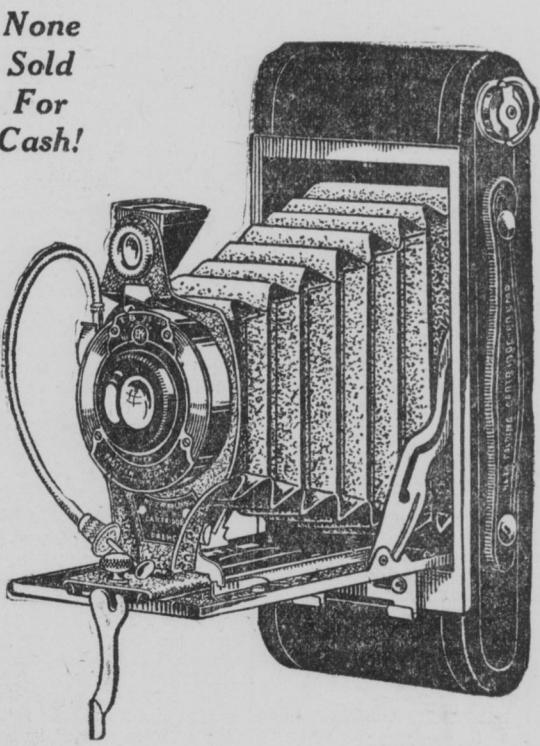
