

## SEEK TO TRACE OIL BONDS BY NEW WITNESS

Alien Property With  
Will Hays.

ASHINGTON, April 2.—Thomas Miller, former alien property alien, has been subpoenaed to appear before the Senate Teapot Dome Committee, Senator Walsh of Mass. announced today. Walsh said Miller had been released to appear Tuesday, but that he had asked and had been granted a week's delay.

Miller was convicted several months ago in New York of conspiracy to defraud the Government while he held the alien property post.

There have been reports that Colonel Miller knew something about the Continental Trading Company bonds," Walsh said. Committee members have addressed questions to witnesses in recent hearings seeking to learn if Miller aided Will Hays, former Chairman of the Republican national committee, in disposing of the \$160,000 of bonds which Harry Sinclair donated to the Republican committee.

**Probe Salt Creek Contract**

Several witnesses have been subpoenaed for the hearing Tuesday, but their names were not divulged because the subpoenas have not yet been served.

The Justice department and Senate Teapot Dome Committee are investigating the means by which the Midwest Refining Company acquired drilling rights in the Salt Creek fields adjoining the Teapot Dome Naval Oil Reserve in Wyoming, it is learned today.

The Justice department also is investigating the sale of Government royalty oil from the Salt Creek fields to the Sinclair Crude Oil Purchasing Company under contract made by Albert B. Fall when he was Secretary of Interior.

Both matters are understood to have been discussed at a recent cabinet meeting.

### Lease Renewed

But the Justice Department declines to confirm this or a report that President Coolidge requested the inquiry.

Sinclair obtained the contract in the Salt Creek's field six months after Fall had received from him \$23,000 of Liberty bonds, according to testimony before the Teapot Dome committee. The Sinclair crude Oil Purchasing Company is partly controlled by Sinclair and the Standard Oil Company of Indiana, which also controls the Midwest.

Secretary of Interior Work recently renewed the Sinclair crude oil contract, explaining he had no objection to Fall and Sinclair. Defense strategy of Sinclair, scheduled to go on trial here on Wednesday on a charge of conspiring to defraud the Government, was planned by his lawyers here today.

### Plan Sinclair Defense

Martin W. Littleton, Sinclair's chief attorney, came from New York to confer with George P. Hoover, local lawyer.

Hoover indicated the line the defense would follow, would depend upon the conference with Littleton and the character of the defense deposition given by former Secretary of Interior Fall, ill in El Paso.

The trial of both Sinclair and Fall, indicated three years ago in connection with the Teapot Dome lease, was scheduled to start today, but Justice Jennings Bailey in District of Columbia Supreme Court three weeks ago granted an indefinite postponement to Fall because of his illness, and postponed the Sinclair trial until Wednesday.
