

HOLY WEEK TO BE OBSERVED IN CHURCHES

Special Devotions Are
Scheduled by All
Pastors.

Protestants and Catholics alike have made plans to observe Holy week, which leads up to Easter Sunday, with city-wide devotional services. More attention this year is being paid to Good Friday when an effort will be made to have all people between noon and 3 o'clock at least meditate for some minutes.

A Holy week program is announced by the Rev. W. T. Jones at the Edwin Ray Methodist Episcopal Church. He will preach each night this week with the exception of Saturday at 7:45 o'clock. His subject tonight will be "The Trial of Jesus."

Tonight at 7:45 o'clock at the Broadway M. E. Church, Dr. Ernest N. Evans, executive secretary of the Church Federation, will speak. Services will be held each night and on Friday afternoon a Good Friday service will be held with Bishop F. D. Leete preaching.

A union service of the Lutheran churches will be held at noon Friday at the First English Lutheran Church and this service will continue three hours. The Rev. Bert R. Johnson will preach nightly at the Downey Avenue Christian Church, his subject tonight being "The Midnight Vigil."

Noon services will be held daily

at Christ Episcopal Church. Bishop Joseph M. Francis speaks today. Other churches have announced special devotional services for the week.

MASONS BUILD TEMPLE

Oakland Lodge Awards Contract for \$20,000 Edifice.

OAKLAND CITY, Ill., April 2.—A general contract for \$20,000 has been awarded to a local contractor for the new Masonic temple here, and work will start as soon as weather conditions permit.

The structure will be brick and stone, with a sixty-three-foot frontage and a fifty-eight-foot depth. The ground floor will have a social room thirty-five by sixty feet, and a kitchen, boiler and fuel rooms.

The lodge room will be on the main floor, with lounge and reception rooms adjoining. The second floor will have a lodge room, balcony and an assembly room.

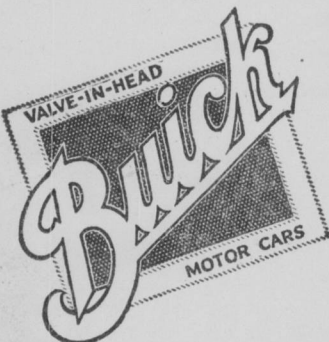
