

WALSH DENIES HE IS IN RACE TO 'GET SMITH'

Cites Reasons for M'Adoo
Support; Corruption to
Be His Target.

WASHINGTON, April 6.—Senator
Walsh of Montana has denounced
reports that he is "out to get Al
Smith" in the Democratic presi-
dential race.

In a letter to W. W. McDowell,
Montana State Democratic chair-
man, made public here today, Walsh
stated he entered the race on the
advice of Democrats who believed
political corruption would be the big
issue and chose him to conduct the
fight, because of his Teapot Dome
investigation.

"It is needless to assure those who
know me as well as you do that I
could not be prevailed upon to par-
ticipate in such a contest or any
contest to help wreck vengeance on
any man," Walsh wrote in reference
to published reports that he was
"out to get Smith."

Walsh said his friendship for Wil-
liam G. McAdoo, Smith's old op-
ponent, dates back to 1912.

"Our views upon public questions
and national and international
policies are approximately identical,"
Walsh said. "By long association
our friends within the party are to
no small extent identical."

Walsh reasoned, therefore, that it
was but natural McAdoo should
support him for the nomination.
"It would be more sportsmanlike,
as well as more conducive to ulti-
mate success, should the contest
proceed in friendly rivalry rather
than in recrimination, in which the
motives of opponents would, on a
basis of speculation only, be reck-
lessly impugned," he continued.

"The Republican enemy offers a
more inviting opening for attack,"
Walsh pledged himself to tariff
revision, for farm relief, opening
of the Great Lakes-St. Lawrence
waterway, development of the Mis-
sissippi and Colorado rivers, and cor-
rections in the fiscal system.

trial Monday.

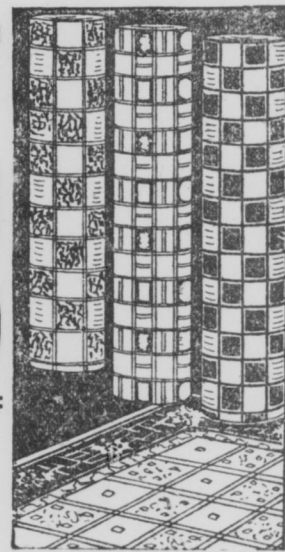

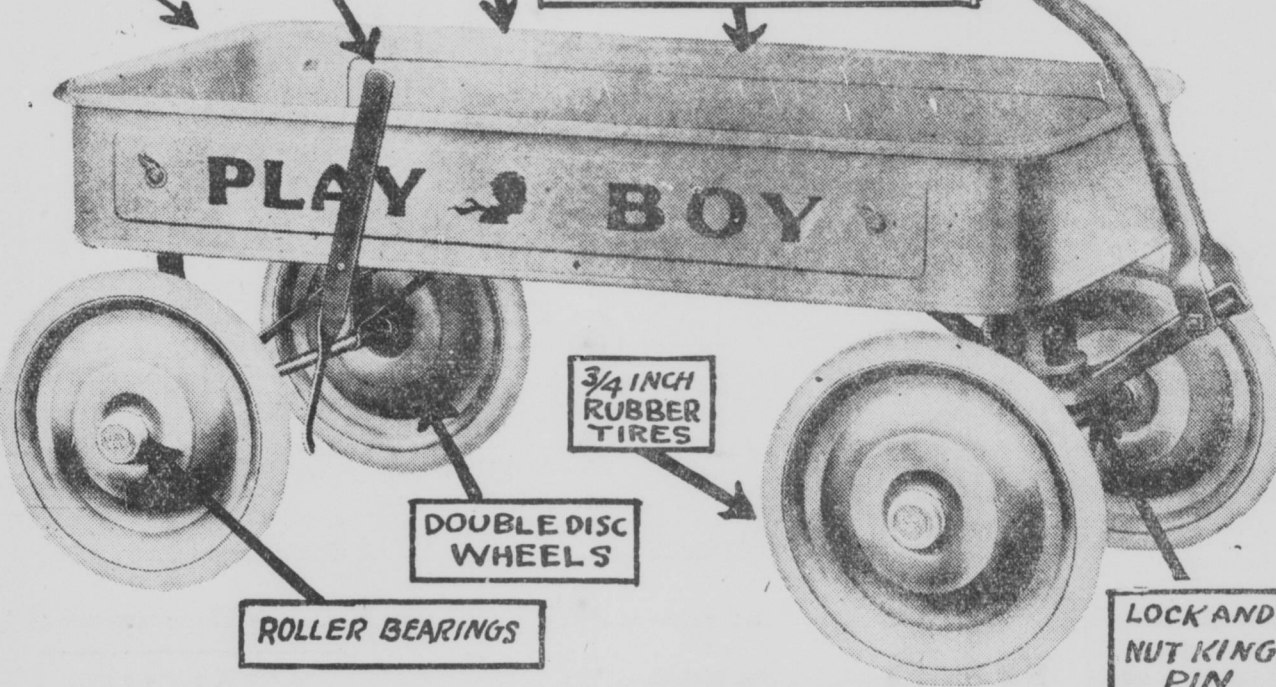

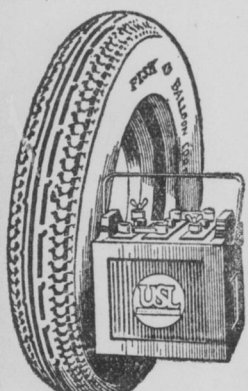
