

MEET TO DRAFT 1928 PLATFORM OF SOCIALISTS

Presidential Nominee to Be
Named at Parley
Tuesday.

NEW YORK, April 13.—Delegates to the sixteenth national convention of the Socialist party will gather at the Manhattan Opera House here tonight to make plans designed to better their position on the political map of the United States.

So that organizations of a platform and selection of a presidential candidate may be handled expeditiously, only 200 delegates will take an active part in the four-day meeting.

Morris Hillquit, prominent New York attorney, international secretary of the Socialist party, and a member of the national executive committee, will deliver the keynote address.

After graduating from Princeton Thomas studied for the ministry and for a time was ordained, was

pastor of the famous Brick Presbyterian Church of New York.

In 1924 he was a candidate for the office of Governor of New York, and in 1925 he was candidate for mayor of New York City. He was instrumental in founding the American Civil Liberties Union.

Mayor Daniel Webster Hoan of Milwaukee, mentioned as a possible candidate for President or Vice President, will take an active part in formulating the platform.

Other presidential possibilities are: Congressman Victor L. Berger of Wisconsin, national chairman of the Socialist party, and the only representative of his party in Congress; James H. Maurer of Reading, Pa., and Upton Sinclair of California.
