

HOUSTON HOST TO PARLEY ON FOREIGN TRADE

Latin-American Commerce Chief Theme of Three Day Convention.

HOUSTON, Tex., April 25.—Delegates from twenty foreign countries and thirty States—1,500 in all—gathered here today for the three-day session of the National Foreign Trade convention.

United States trade with Latin America will be the principal theme of the convention.

Plan Mexican Trip
Representatives of several Latin American countries will confer with business executives on American sales and distribution practices most successful south of the Rio Grande and on import, credit, banking and advertising questions of vital interest to North and South American trade.

After the convention a large group of delegates from the United States will take a fourteen-day trip to Mexico, stopping at Monterey, Tampico, Aguascalientes and other cities en route to the capital.

They will visit President Calles and the Mexican departments of agriculture and commerce, studying Mexican conditions with a view to promoting friendly relations between Mexican and American business men.

Politics Excluded
A special Latin American session of the convention will be held Friday morning, devoted to the promotion of modern and friendly business methods and the interchange of essential commodities.

TROLLEY VALUE CUT IS SOUGHT

Street Car Company Asks Lower Assessment.

It was pleading day for the Indianapolis Street Railway Company at the Statehouse Tuesday.

While President Robert I. Todd and Counsel Michael E. Foley were before the State tax board asking a lower tax valuation for the company properties, Attorney David E.

Watson and Superintendent James P. Tretton presented arguments before Public Service Commissioner Howell Ellis in opposition to a proposed bus extension service demanded by citizens. The extension would run on Fifty-Ninth St., and cover almost five miles, from Central Ave. to Keystone Ave.

In the tax board argument the company officials declared that they spent \$611,797 last year in improvements and underwent a revenue loss of \$496,817 over 1926. Gross earnings for 1927 were given at \$541,670.

Regarding the bus line petition, real estate men testified that the outskirts of the district is rapidly being populated and would support the line. The company claims not and they were allowed ten days to secure evidence.

LIQUID THEFT CAUSES LIQUOR LAW CHARGE

Wabash Attorney Accused After Boys Loot Home Cellar.

WABASH, Ind., April 25.—Frank

Plummer, local lawyer, is free under \$500 bond pending trial on a liquor possession charge as a result of the theft of what authorities say is wine from the cellar of his home. Four high school boys said to have stolen the liquid were arrested by police near the home.

Although Plummer insisted the loot was merely grape juice that had

been in the cellar four years, police declared it wine, and a grand jury indicted Plummer.

Police favored filing charges against the boys, but Plummer said he did not wish to prosecute.

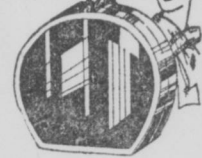
Conviction of Plummer is not likely, local attorneys say, as the liquid was seized without a search warrant.
