MARGUERITE NAMARA, American operatic, concert musical comedy soprano, will be the guest soloist of the Maxwell House hour to be broadcast at 7 tonight over the NBC Blue network from WJZ, New York. Stations in the hook-up are listed in Dial Twisters.

In this concert Miss Namara sings "Ah, Fors e Lui," and aria from the Verdi opera, "La Traviata," "Aquarelles," by Debussy, under whom Miss Namara studied in Paris, Kahn's "Beloved," "La Partida," by Alvarez and "The Madonna's Lullaby" by Mindred Lord.

A concert orchestra, under the direction of Nathaniel Shilkret will play his own composition, "Fun in the Snow," from "New England Sketches," "Uncle Remus Rhapsody," by Morris, and other numbers. The complete program for this broadcast follows:

program of compositions by Peter Iljitsch Tschaikowsky, distinguished Russian composer, will be presented during the Ampico hour of music, which will be broadcast through stations associated with the NBC Blue network tonight at 6:30.

Two movements from the well-known string quartet, played by the Ampico string group, will open and close the program, the latter passage being one of the best-known pieces of chamber music in the world. Recordings of Sergei Rachmaninoff's playing of "Troika" (Op. 37, No. 11, E Major), and "Valse" (Op. 40, No. 8, A Flat), will be heard. Emanuel Hirsh will play "None But the Lonely Heart" as a viola solo, and Albert Verchamp, director of the string quartet, will play "Melodie" (Op. 42, No. 3) as a violin solo.




