

RIOTS SUBSIDE IN JUGO-SLAVIA; FEAR RENEWAL

Situation Still Tense, With
Feeling Against Italy
Running High.

BELGRADE, June 1.—A measure of quiet prevailed through Jugoslavia today after the series of anti-Fascist disturbances of the past few days, in which many persons have been injured and official notes have passed between the two governments.

The most serious difficulties occurred Wednesday night and officials communicated said today that sixty-four persons, including both gendarmes and demonstrators, had been injured. Twenty-one of those injured are in serious condition.

The communique said forty-five persons, including thirty Communists, were under arrest.

The Italian minister, Bordero, had an audience with the king last night and took official leave of the country. He informed his majesty that the new Italian minister, Galli, already was in Rome, prepared to entrain for Jugoslavia.

Although the situation remained somewhat calm in Belgrade, reports here said that thousands had staged an anti-Italian demonstration in Skopje. Police intervened and finally dispersed the demonstrators, but not until after the gendarmes had swung their rifle butts at the foremost leaders of the crowd.

Also it was learned today that the Jugoslav government had decided not to reply to Italy's note until its consul had ascertained the damage to Jugoslav property as a result of demonstrations in Fiume, Trieste and Zara.

The government desires an answer from Italy concerning the incident at Zara, of which the Jugoslav authorities wrote to Rome recently.

LONDON, June 1.—A dispatch to the Daily Express today said that the powerful Jugoslav semi-secret society Narodna Obrana had summoned a public anti-Italian meeting in Belgrade Sunday.

The message, coming from Vienna, said that Fascists had renewed anti-Jugoslav rioting in Zara, Wednesday night. The Fascists entered the Jugoslav consulate, took the flag from the consul's motor car and burned it on the seafloor, while shouting "war with Jugoslav." The dispatch said.

HENRY FORD SUMMONED TO DEFEND ANTIQUES

Must Appear in Orphan's Court in
Suit by Donor's Mother.

BRIDGEPORT, N. J., June 1.—Henry Ford will be cited to appear in the Cumberland County Orphans' court early in July to defend some antique treasures left to him.

Under the will of William E. Haskell, his collection of antique glassware, china, hooked rugs, quilts and furniture was left to Mr. Henry Ford of Detroit, Michigan, to be used as exhibits and are never to be sold or given away.

Mrs. Hannah A. Haskell, his mother, is contesting the will and newspaper notice was given to all the beneficiaries, including the automobile manufacturer.

PROHIBITION FAILS, VIEW OF MUNCIE POLICE HEAD

Declares Indiana Laws Hamper Law
Enforcement.

MUNCIE, Ind., June 1.—"Prohibition is a failure," according to Arthur B. Jones, Muncie police chief.

Jones made the statement in commenting on a recent announcement by Chief Jacob Graul, Cleveland, Ohio, who urged a return to the saloon as a solution of troubles arising from attempts to enforce dry laws.

Indiana laws, requiring search warrants for liquor, hamper officials in enforcing prohibition, Chief Jones believes. He considers the saloon an evil, but offers no other solution of the liquor problem.

AMERICAN GIRL ENTERS GERMAN BOAT RACES

Takes Two Motor Boats for Speed
Competition.

NEW YORK, June 1.—The only American entry in the international motor boat races to be held on Lake Templin, Germany, June 15-17, will be a Long Island girl, Miss Helen Hentschel.

Miss Hentschel has sailed for Hamburg to compete against drivers from England, Germany, France and Italy. She took with her three American-built stock motors and two specially-designed boats for the competition.

The international course on Lake Templin is two and a half miles long and lies between Berlin and Potsdam. After competing abroad Miss Hentschel will return in time to enter the Exposition races at Long Beach, Cal., in August.

EVANSVILLE, Ind., June 1.—The will of Mrs. Annie E. Taylor, submitted for probate here Thursday, provides for establishment of a lecture series on the United States Constitution at Butler University, Indianapolis, to be known as the "Edwin Taylor Lectures on Government," as a memorial to her husband, a Butler graduate.




