

## HITS DAILEY AS 'BOSS-RIDDEN CITY' RESIDENT

Frederick Attempts to Stem  
Sweeps of Convention  
Here Wednesday.

Attempting to stem the tide of Democratic sentiment which promises to sweep Frank C. Dailey into the gubernatorial nomination on an early ballot in the Democratic State convention here Wednesday, John E. Frederick, Kokomo manufacturer, who ran 30,000 votes behind Dailey in the primary, has sent letters to the 1,182 delegates labelling Dailey as a resident of the "boss-ridden capital city."

Although Dailey carried sixty-nine of the ninety-two counties in the State and attained 30,000 of his 50,000 plurality outside of Marion County, Frederick in his appeal to delegates, predicts defeat for the party in November if Dailey, an Indianapolis resident, is nominated.

Encloses Stamped Envelope

"It is my belief," the letter to delegates read, "that we can profit by the sentiment shown at the recent Republican State convention, when a vast majority of the delegates refused absolutely to consider an Indianapolis candidate for Governor. Due to political conditions in Marion County in recent years, the people of our State are not inclined to turn over their entire political structure to the boss-ridden capital city."

"Few would say that, with our candidate for President, Evans Woollen, and our candidate for United States Senator, Albert Stump, both Indianapolis residents, it would be the part of political prudence for us to name a Marion County man for our gubernatorial nominee. This in the face of the further fact that Indiana has defeated every Indianapolis candidate for Governor in the last fifty-six years, among them five Democratic candidates."

Frederick, asking an expression of delegates' views, enclosed a stamped and addressed return envelope with each letter he sent out.

Popularity State-Wide

Dailey came to Indianapolis from Bluffton, Ind., where he was born, reared and entered the law practice, January, 1914, when he was appointed United States district attorney. He has resided here ever since, although Bluffton persists in its claim upon him.

His friends point out that his services as district attorney and special assistant to the United States Attorney General in the prosecution of election frauds indicate his freedom from "boss-ridden" politics and fit him for the political clean-up that exposures of political corruption make timely.

Primary returns bear as evidence that Dailey's popularity was State-wide, the fact that he attained a majority of votes in thirty-six of the sixty-nine counties he carried. He received a majority in five districts and a plurality in four others.

Demands Ninth District.

He failed of a plurality in the First, Fifth, Ninth and Thirteenth Districts; but in the Fifth carried four of six counties; in the Ninth, Frederick's home district, carried four of the eight counties; and in the Thirteenth, carried six out of seven, losing St. Joseph county because of South Bend.

Frederick, it is understood, is demanding the support of all the delegates in the Ninth district,

where each carried four counties,

and at the same time asking an even split off Seventh District (Marion County) delegates where Dailey received 21,066 votes to 1,077 for

Frederick.
