

SMITH, HOOVER BID FOR AID IN BORDER STATES

Both Sides See Victory If
'Sure' Sections Come
Through.

WASHINGTON, July 4.—The
conventions over, politicians today
began the preparation of their "if"
tables on the November results.

Enthusiastic supporters of Gov-
ernor Smith foresee a victory for
their candidate if the "solid South"
remains solid and they win the
border States, New York, New Jer-
sey, Massachusetts and a few others.
Republicans discount this enthusi-
asm. They visualize a Republican
victory next fall and are figuring on
the normal Republican majorities in
the normally Republican States.

Four years ago President Coolidge
got 352 electoral votes out of the
total of 523. John W. Davis got only
138 and the late Senator La Follette,
13. Coolidge polled 15,725,018 popu-
lar votes, Davis, 8,386,503, and La
Follette and the Socialist candidate
combined got 4,822,856.

Credit Hoover With 88

Secretary Hoover is credited with
88 electoral votes at the start: Penn-
sylvania, 38; Iowa, 13; Kansas 10;
Maine, 6; New Hampshire, 4; Rhode
Island, 5; Utah, 4; Vermont, 4;
Idaho, 4.

Opposition to Governor Smith be-
cause of his religion and his views
on prohibition also influence calcu-
lations. Hoover faces dissatisfaction
among the western farmers,
who are normally Republican. Politi-
cians claim these obstacles will be
overcome by each candidate, but
thoughtful observers say this under-
current cannot now be properly
gauged.

If Governor Smith holds the solid
South he will have 114 votes from
Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Geor-
gia, Mississippi, North Carolina,
South Carolina, Texas, Virginia and
Louisiana.

There are 76 votes in the "border"
States: Missouri, 13; Kentucky, 13;
Oklahoma, 10; Tennessee, 12; Mary-
land, 18, and West Virginia, 8.

Personal Votes Feature

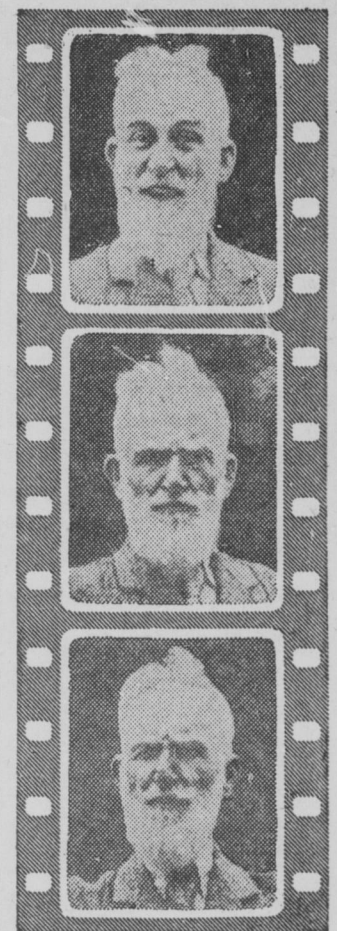
New York has 45 votes, and
Governor Smith's supporters believe
he will win them. They say the
same of Massachusetts with 18 and
New Jersey with 14. Republicans
disagree. Similar controversial
claims are made with regard to the
Republican States of Ohio, Illinois,
California, Indiana, Michigan and
Wisconsin.

Democrats challenge also Republi-
cans claims to Nebraska, North
and South Dakota, Wyoming, Mon-
tana, Oregon, Washington, New
Mexico and Arizona.
But the figures four years ago
are different, with dissatisfied vot-
ers in both parties. Normal ma-
chine majorities will count less be-
cause of the tremendous personal
followings of Hoover and Smith, it
is held.

PLAN ART BUILDING

Gift Provides for Erection of
Structure.

Announcement that a new art
school building will be erected on
the John Herron Art Institute
grounds as result of an anonymous
gift to the Art Association of Indi-
anapolis, was made today by Evans
Woollen, association president.

Plans for the new structure have
been given the board of directors
by Paul P. Cret, Philadelphia archi-
tect, who drew the plans for the
Indianapolis Central Library.

The new building will be of fire-
proof construction, faced with brick,
harmonizing with the museum,
which faces Sixteenth St. at Penn-
sylvania St. It will be larger than
the present art school, now stand-
ing in the rear of the museum, and
will have two floors and a base-
ment. There will be housing fa-
cilities for 250 students.

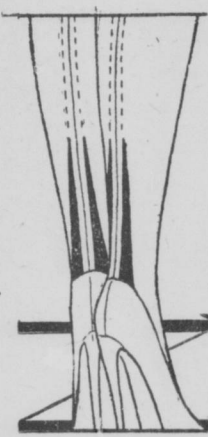
Construction will be started soon,

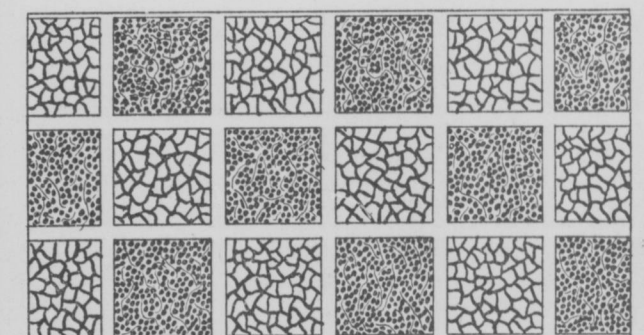
