

KLAN HOPES TO REBUILD POWER BY FIGHTING AL

Meet in Chicago to Plan
Anti-Smith Issues for
Campaign.

WASHINGTON, July 20.—National officials of the Ku Klux Klan are hoping that Al Smith will rehabilitate the order.
They are to meet in Chicago next week to discuss the national situation and to lay plans for a membership drive, hoping that the nomination of a Catholic wet may rearouse the spirit which netted the Klan

millions of members when it first started.
Although they are secretive about Klan affairs, it is understood membership has dropped greatly in several states, notably Indiana.
The Chicago meeting, it is said, will take the place of the national "Klanvocation" which has been held in Washington for the last two years.
The Fellowship Forum, weekly national newspaper affiliated with the Klan, has already plunged into the fight against Smith. James S. Vance, editor, has published an appeal for contributions which he announces will be used to "flood America with the truth."

The \$250 check sent to Senator Heflin of Alabama by P. J. Maloney of New York, a Catholic, with a sarcastic message expressing Maloney's thanks to Heflin for the service he is rendering to the Catholic Church, has been turned over to the Forum by Heflin.
Vance announced that this money would be used to send out as many

copies of the Forum as possible, and that it would head the contribution list.
The possibility of rehabilitation of the Klan was pointed out by W. F. Zimmerman, its national counsel, when he testified before the Senate Campaign Investigating Committee recently.
He said Heflin's anti-Smith talks were financed by local Klans because of their effect in arousing interest and recruiting memberships.

PUBLIC HANGINGS URGED TO HALT CRIME WAVE

Bill to Be Presented in California Legislature.

SACRAMENTO, Cal., July 20.—A bill will be presented to the 1929 session of the California State Legislature providing that each county in the State must hang its own murderers on a public gallows in the town square.
The bill will further provide that the hangings are to be preceded by the proper amount of advertising so that a large number of spectators will be present at the execution.
By this means, supporters of the bill hope to impress upon the people in general, and in particular

those who are contemplating murder, the penalty which is exacted for their crimes.

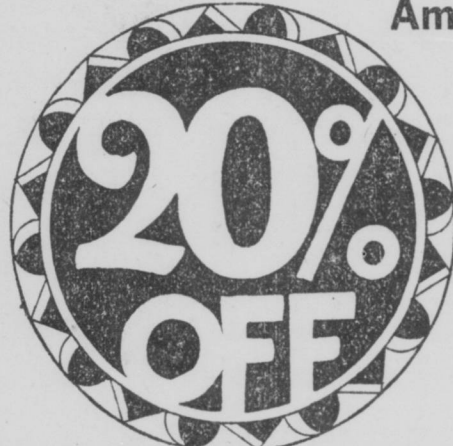
