

## MARINE PLANES ON REBEL HUNT AFTER SKIRMISH

One American Dead, Three Wounded in Set-to With Nicaraguans.

PERTO, C. BEZAS, Nicaragua, Aug. 9.—Marine airplanes flashed over the Coco River region near Bokay today searching for a group of rebels who fought a marine patrol Tuesday, killing one United States marine and injuring three others. Ten of the rebels were killed while three others were wounded.

Myer Stengel, Hartford, Conn., was killed.

The marines injured were: Thomas Faine, Roxbury, Mass.; Tushel Schoenberger, South Charleston, W. Va., and Melvin Mosier, Topeka, Kan. All three were brought to Puerto Cabezas by airplane.

**Boats Fired on**  
Only the most meager information has come to Puerto Cabezas about the engagement.

A marine patrol of forty-eight men, in command of Capt. M. A. Edson of Burlington, Vt., had been proceeding in boats up the Coco River.

About sixty miles above Bokay the marines encountered the rebel group and a fierce engagement occurred.

The engagement was said to have lasted for several hours after which the rebels disappeared, following the river. Captain Edson, after ordering his wounded men taken to Puerto Cabezas for treatment, immediately started an airplane flight in search of the men.

**Planes Aid**

Airplanes were sent from Puerto Cabezas to aid in the search.

## WARNS FOREIGN NATIONS OUT TO BUY U. S. SHIPS

Charges Future of Marine Periled by Britain and Germany.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 9.—German and British shipping interests are planning to acquire the United States shipping board offers them for sale this month, Senator Duncan U. Fletcher of Florida believes.

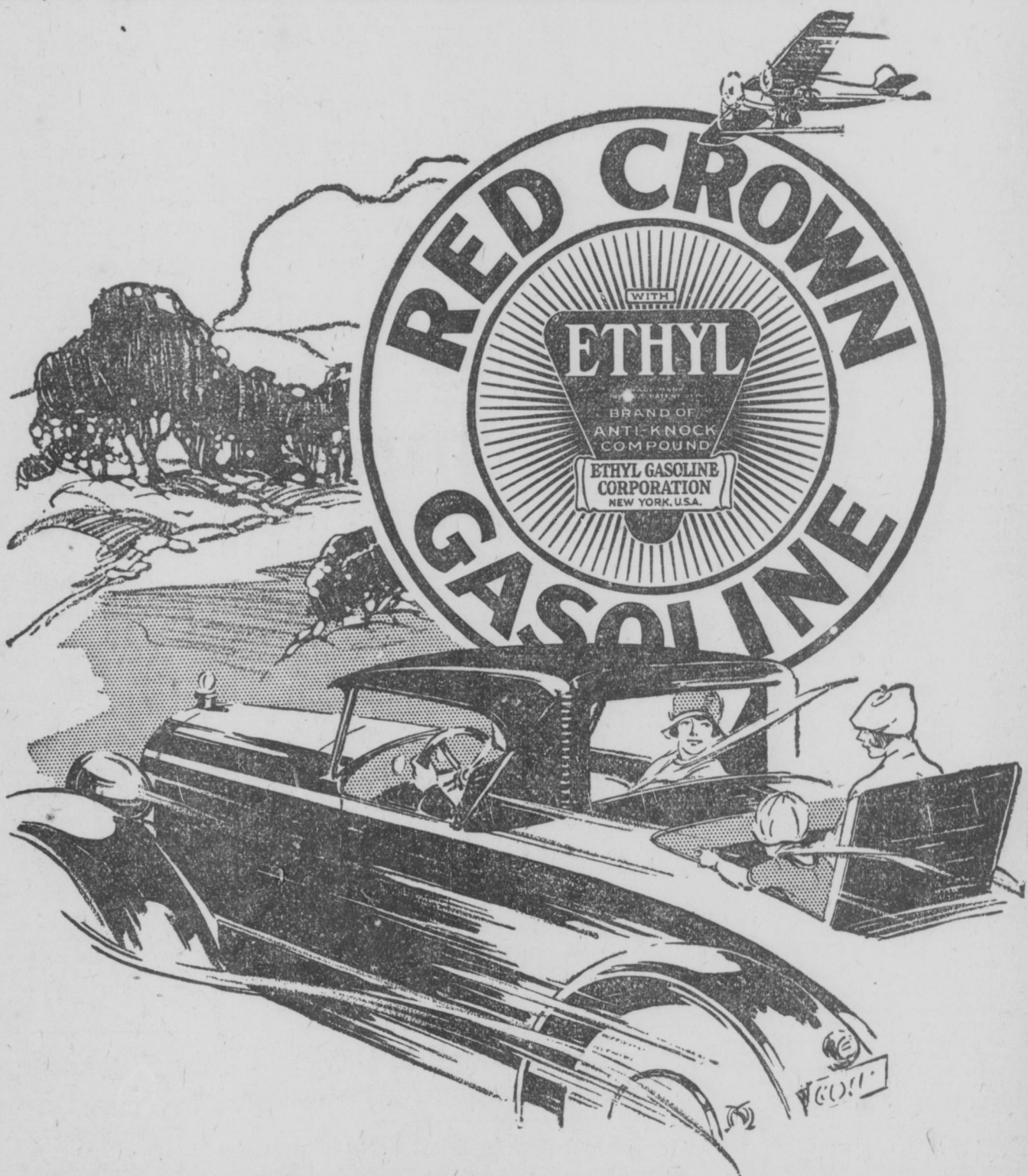
