

DENIES G. O. P. TO BLAME FOR OFFICE MISUSE

Edgar Bush Slaps Dailey,
Lauds Hoover in Ft.
Wayne Address.

DET. WAYNE, Ind., Sept. 13.—Flat denial of party responsibility for the misconduct of Republican officeholders was made before 300 Allen County Republicans Thursday night by Edgar D. Bush, Republican nominee for Lieutenant Governor, sounding the G. O. P. State ticket's challenge to the Democratic gubernatorial nominee, Frank C. Dailey.

As loudly as he had denounced Herbert Hoover at the Republican national convention, Bush lauded the presidential nominee and turned his tirade upon Dailey.

Says Smith "Lost"

Democratic leaders Bush declared, have given up hope of swinging Indiana for Alfred E. Smith for President and are concentrating their efforts on Dailey's election.

Bush praised Dailey as "one of the best corporation lawyers anywhere," adding that "when you pay a telephone toll of 75 cents you pay 25 cents to the wisdom and sagacity of Frank C. Dailey."

"The real issue," Bush shouted, "is that we have the job and the Democrats want it."

Clean Own House

Without venturing to name Governor Ed Jackson, Bush exclaimed: "The Republican party has not put its stamp of approval on the misconduct of any official. We clean our own house."

"If you will roll up the vote in this northern section of the State for Hoover and Curtiss that we will in southern Indiana, the State will go Republican by 300,000 in November," Bush predicted.

FREE BOYS NAMED IN
BURGLARY CONFESSION

Youth Retracts Admission; Charges
Force Used.

Vatchel White, 757 Virginia Ave., and Harry Noey, 436 S. West St., who had been implicated in a series of robberies by a confession alleged to have been made detectives by Milburn Jones, 17, of Danville, Ind., were discharged by Judge Paul C. Wetter, Thursday.

VICTORY IS NEAR IN CORN BORER FIGHT

Government Successful in
Battling Pest Under
New System.

AVIATION IS THE RAGE
IN FILM FOLK COLONY

WASHINGTON, Sept. 14.—More than a million square feet of copper screening was used in the construction of two gigantic cages which experts of the United States Bureau of Entomology employed in a unique experiment to determine effectiveness of methods for controlling the destructive corn borer.

The cages were built on a farm maintained by the bureau in a heavily infested region near Toledo, Ohio. Each cage was nine feet high and covered an acre of corn, planted after the soil had been treated to destroy the larvae.

As the moths appeared they collected on the top and sides of the cage, from which they were gathered with butterfly nets. Actual count was made of the number which emerged and this count, just completed, reveals that control methods developed by the bureau are more than 98 per cent effective. As a result, the Department of Agriculture will redouble efforts to persuade farmers to use these methods in the American corn belt.

From 25 to 40 per cent of the corn crop frequently is destroyed in regions infested by this dangerous pest, which, since its discovery near Boston in 1917, has spread over approximately 100,000 acres of corn country. In Ontario, destruction has reached a record high of between 75 and 80 per cent of the crop.

Entomologists are convinced that it will be impossible to eradicate the corn borer but the recent experiment indicates that it can be controlled sufficiently to reduce commercial losses to a negligible amount.
