

ECLIPSES, STAR SHOWERS DUE IN NOVEMBER

Annual 'Rain' of Meteors Scheduled for Latter Part of Month.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1.—A shower of meteors as well as a shower of votes is due in November. Astronomers will be busier than politicians. An eclipse of the moon is coming Nov. 27, and will be visible in North and South America, the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans, Australia, the western and northern extremities of Europe and part of eastern Asia.

The total phase will last nearly one hour.

Sun Eclipse Also

Total eclipse of the moon are observed far more generally than total eclipses of the sun, since they may be seen from more than half of the earth's surface while a total eclipse of the sun is visible only within a very narrow path of great length.

There also is to be a partial eclipse of the sun on Nov. 12 with a maximum magnitude of 81 per cent of the sun's diameter covered by the moon.

This will be visible only in the British Isles, the greater part of Europe, Egypt and western and central Asia.

Meteor Showers Due

The two annual periodic showers of meteors due in November are the Andromedes or Dielids, so-called because they are probably remnants of Biela's lost comet and the Leonids, which follow in the orbit of another comet, called after its discoverer, Tempel's comet of 1868.

The reddish, slowly moving Andromedes may be seen anywhere

HUGE PARADE PLANNED FOR ARMISTICE DAY

Promise Biggest Celebration Since A. E. F. Troops Came Home.

Plans for the biggest parade in Indianapolis since the troops came home ten years ago are nearing completion for the Armistice day celebration, Nov. 12, according to Dr. George W. Bowman, chairman of the general committee.

More than 300 persons have been invited to witness the parade from the reviewing stand in Monument Circle where a civic mass meeting and a band concert will comprise the memorial services.

"This parade is not to honor the dead alone, but to recall the sacri-

fices which the living have made and may be called upon to make in the preservation of national life," declared Colonel A. J. Daugherty, chief of staff of the Eighty-fourth division Organized Reserve Corps and a member of the program committee.

A proclamation urging observance of the day in all schools, industries and civic bodies will be issued by Mayor L. Ert Slack.

The state has formally pledged to commemorate the occasion through Governor Jackson ordering all state offices to be closed.

Chairman Bowman stated that business firms have expressed willingness to co-operate by suspending business entirely or by permitting employees to participate in the parade. Children planning to take part in the parade will be excused from school. The courthouse will be closed, while the city hall will pause in its daily routine between 10 a. m. and 1 p. m.

Eight units representing military, fraternal, juvenile, civic and high

school cadet organizations will be in the line of march at 10 a. m. as the parade moves from American Legion headquarters at St. Clair and Meridian streets south to the main building of the World war plaza where flowers will be strewn on the steps in honor of Indiana's World war dead. The procession will then proceed to Monument Circle where a talk by the Rev. Edwin Dunlavy, invocation by Rabbi Morris M. Feuerlicht and benediction by the Rev. Father M. W. Lyons will be followed by a band concert under the direction of J. B. Vandaworker.

There will be no activities in the

afternoon, but in the evening a victory ball will be held at the Indiana ballroom under the auspices of the Reserve Officers Association. Radio addresses by President Coolidge and General John J. Pershing will be heard. The celebration is scheduled for Monday because Armistice day falls on Sunday this year. Automobiles will be provided for wounded veterans, who signify their intention of participating, by calling the Armistice day committee at 510 Meridian Life building.

It looks as if about 50 per cent of the voters of Marion county may be disfranchised at the coming election. Marion county has been polluted with political corruption and scandal. Vice, crime and corruption have been carried to the limit. Taxpayers' money has been squandered. Taxpayers' rights have been ignored. It is time for the men and women of Marion county to put a stop to this process of degradation. They can do it at this election.
