

MILLIONS WILL BE SPENT FOR YULETIDE TOYS

Young America Getting Ready for Annual Deluge of Gifts.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—On Christmas morning the young American girl will be fondling ten million dollars worth of dolls while the American small boy will be preparing to wreck about fifteen million dollars of rolling-stock in the form of toy automobiles, airplanes, wagons and trains.

American worship of Santa Claus makes toy production one of the country's typical big businesses, susceptible of measurement in the large round numbers which delight the government scientist.

**Gain in Production**  
Production in the United States, according to the last bureau of census compilation available, amounted to about \$75,000,000 annually, of which dolls alone accounted for nearly twelve million dollars, with one and one-half million extra for the miniature wardrobe, and nearly three million for her carriages and carts.

The present year probably has witnessed an increase in this production.

Ordinarily, the domestic toy mills are incapable of meeting the requirements of the American toy trade, and there is a heavy annual importation from Germany and Japan.

Imports from Germany amount to four to six million dollars annually and from Japan three to four million; Czechoslovakia, France and England ship lesser quantities. Germany provides large quantities of Christmas tree ornaments, wooden toys, and toy musical instruments; Japan sends paper and celluloid toys.

The contribution of American industry to the children's merry Christmas consists largely of toys of mechanical or educational nature.

Among the former are toy airplanes, locomotives, power stations, signal cars, and spring operated Robots in miniature.

Educational toys include building blocks, construction sets, drawing and painting sets, and wax modeling outfits.

"Too Skinny"

'CHUTE BLOCKS CABIN DOOR; SIX DIE IN PLANE

Two Leap to Safety When Ship Goes Out of Control.

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Nov. 15.—Six soldiers killed Wednesday when a transport plane crashed near here, were trapped in the cabin by folds of an open parachute, an investigation of the wrecked biplane revealed today.

Two men leaped free of the falling plane and floated to safety in their parachutes. They were Lieutenant Harvey F. Dyer, pilot, of Beverly, Kan., and Sergeant Frank J. Siebenaler, Milwaukee.

**Accident at 3,000 Feet**  
The cabin doors were blocked by the opened parachute, apparently opened too soon, or accidentally, by one of the soldiers.

Lieutenant Dyer said the big plane went out of control at an altitude of 3,000 feet. He said he shouted to the men to jump. Then

he and Siebenaler, in open seats, leaped.

"I was knocked unconscious when part of the plane struck me just after I jumped," Dyer said. "I regained consciousness just as the parachute lowered me to the ground."

Wing fittings of the plane, investigating officers said, broke, causing the ship to get out of control. Shortly after the two men had leaped, the right wing broke from the plane and fell.

Flew For Coolidge  
Lieutenant Dyer is one of the pilots who carried mail for President Coolidge when the President was vacationing in the Black Hills two years ago.

The six soldiers killed were: Private Niceford Villarodri and Puanita Cochabamba, Bolivia; Carl W. Harris, Winnisboro, Tex.; Arthur W. Hardesty, Lebanon Junction, Ky.; Harry W. Gaudin, Callander, Va.; Deane F. McClosky, Placid, Tex.; Irvan Self, Victor, Tex.

HOSIERY HEAD'S HOME BOMBED

Grand Jury Probe Is Asked in Strike Trouble.

LAKE GENEVA, Wis., Nov. 15.—The home of Roger Kimball, vice-president of the Allen A. Hosiery Company, was bombed here last night, marking the twenty-first bombing in the strike of knitters at the hosiery mills in Kenosha, Wis. Several thousand dollars in damage was done to the home by the explosion and fire that followed, Kimball estimated.

The Kimball home was one of the show places in the wealthy colony three miles across the lake from here. The Kenosha Chamber of Commerce has asked a grand jury investigation of the trouble at the mills and a decision is scheduled Tuesday.

No one was in the Kimball home at the time of the explosion. First word of last night's bombing was received in an anonymous telephone call to Kimball.

"Your Lake Geneva home has been bombed," a voice said when Kimball answered the phone and then the connection was out.

Kimball said he had received a score or more threats by mail and telephone since the strike started.
