Burglars Take Pistol and Jewels From Kerns.

Burglaries of stores and homes Thursday night netted thieves a small amount of money in addition

to several hundred dollars worth of clothing, jewelry and other articles. George P. Anderson told police his grocery at 2615 East Tenth street was entered and \$36 worth of merchandise stolen. Burglars broke a rear window to enter the Kroger grocery at 1818 Hillside avenue. They took food valued at \$65. John W. Kern Jr., United States commissioner, Apartment 5, 1529 Park avenue, said burglars removed bars from a window of his apartment and ransacked his home. Loot included a strand of pearl beads,

cameo pin, German Luger pistol, pearl studs, coral ear rings, all valued at \$260, and a purse containing \$3. Five dollars was stolen from the home of Mrs. Frank Grant, 3560 North Pennsylvania street. William A. # RETURN 'THE HAWK'

Confessed Blackmailer Is Brought to Noblesville.

Wendell C. Hessong, 21, of Carmel, Ind., who has confessed he is "The Hawk," wrote blackmail letters to Hal L. Putry, vice-president of the Marmon Motor Car Company; Lewis Koss, president of the Capital Iron Company, Indianapolis, and Bailey Hawkins, cashier of the Citizens

State bank of Carmel, was returned to Noblesville today to face blackmail charges. Hessong was arrested at Akron, O., where he confessed writing notes demanding a total of \$3,000 from the three men and threatening them and their families with death if he did not receive the money. Jack Montgomery, another Carmel youth, implicated by Hessong, also is charged with blackmail in connection with the case. He denied knowledge of Hessong's alleged blackmailing activities. He is at liberty under \$3,000 bond.

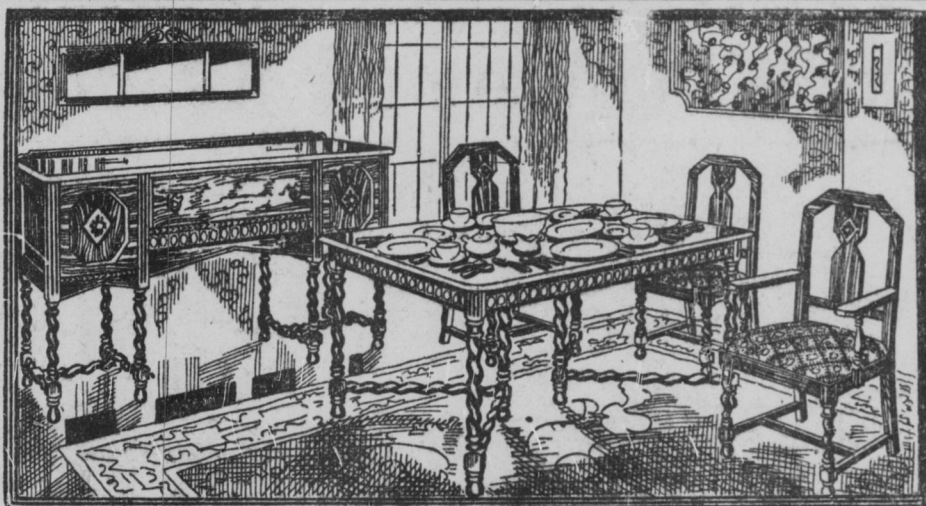

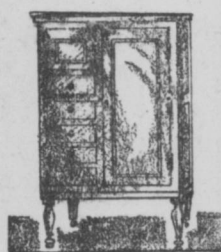

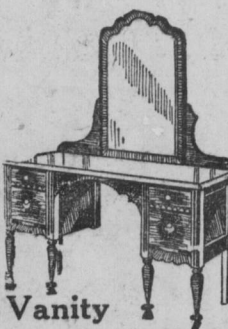
