### RETURN 'THE HAWK'

Confessed Blackmailer Is  
Brought to Noblesville.

Wendell C. Hessong, 21, of Carmel, Ind., who has confessed he is "The Hawk," wrote blackmail letters to Hal L. Pudry, vice-president of the Marmon Motor Car Company; Lewis Koss, president of the Capital Iron Company, Indianapolis, and Bailey Hawkins, cashier of the Citizens

State bank of Carmel, was returned to Noblesville today to face black-mail charges.

Hessong was arrested at Akron, O., where he confessed writing notes demanding a total of \$3,000 from the three men and threatening them and their families with death if he did not receive the money.

Jack Montgomery, another Carmel youth, implicated by Hessong, also is charged with blackmail in connection with the case. He denied knowledge of Hessong's alleged blackmailing activities. He is at liberty under \$3,000 bond.


