

## ASK EX-ALIEN PROPERTY CHIEF BE SET FREE

Parole Sought in U. S. Fraud Case After Seven Months of Sentence.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 30.—Thomas W. Miller, former alien property custodian, convicted in New York two years ago for conspiracy to defraud the government, was recom-

mended for parole today by the federal parole board.

Miller began his eighteen months' sentence in Atlanta federal penitentiary on April 24. Before his parole can become effective, it must be approved by Attorney General Sargent. Miller's conviction grew out of dispositions of German property while he was alien property custodian.

## CAST DOUBT ON 'CONFESSION' IN FURNACE CASE

Man Held at San Antonio Again Is Questioned in Knaak Death.

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Nov. 30.—Although his "confession" to thrusting Miss Elfrieda Knaak into the furnace of the Lake Bluff, Ill., police station is regarded skeptically, James Kelley was questioned again

today by Fort Sam Houston officers.

Kelley said he also was wanted in Lake Forest, Ill., near Lake Bluff, for the murder of another woman, but then retracted another "confession" that he had robbed a woman in Lake Forest.

Kelley was arrested here Wednesday by military police after admitting he was a deserter from Selma, Mich. After "confessing" the Knaak murder, after attempting to hang himself.

He said he had driven an automobile stolen in Chicago to Lake Bluff, "picked up" Miss Knaak at the electric line station there and drove her to the police station to meet a friend.

She went into the station, but returned in a few minutes, saying her friend was not there, Kelley said.

"I want you to kill me," Kelley said she told him.

Kelley said he tried to dissuade

her from her desire for death, but was unable, and accompanied her to the basement.

Kelley said he placed her feet in the furnace first, then her hands. She screamed, he said, so he hit her with a poker to end her sufferings.

Then he tried to thrust her body into the furnace, but the door was too small, he said. Frightened and thinking she was dead, he fled back to Chicago.

Kelley has admitted being confined to several asylums, one in Philadelphia and another in Elgin, Ill.

## POISONER HEIR TO BIG ESTATE

Search for Woman Convicted of Slaying.

LONDON, Nov. 30.—An estate valued at approximately \$700,000 was reported today to be waiting for Mrs. Florence E. Maybrick, an American who figured in a sensational murder trial in England nearly forty years ago.

A Paris lawyer, whose name was not made public, was said to be attempting to establish contact with Mrs. Maybrick to give her the

fortune willed to her by a former husband.

Mrs. Maybrick was understood to be living in Florida.

Mrs. Maybrick was sentenced to death at Liverpool in 1889, after having been found guilty of poisoning her husband, James Maybrick, with arsenic. Subsequently the sentence was commuted to life imprisonment and she was released after serving sixteen years. She returned to the United States.

Mrs. Maybrick was reported at various times since then to have lived in New York, Chicago, near Norfolk, Va., and in Florida.
