

TRIBUTE PAID TO LINCOLN BY CITY GROUPS

Belongs to World, Declares
Prosecutor in Speech
to Legislature.

With schools closed special services at the statehouse, civic clubs and diners scheduled for tonight this city celebrated the birthday of the Great Emancipator, Abraham Lincoln.

At the statehouse Oswald Ryan of Anderson, Madison county prosecutor, addressed a joint meeting of the legislature on Lincoln.

"If every American citizen were to be swept from the earth this morning the rest of the world would preserve the fame of Lincoln," Ryan said.

"Lincoln no longer belongs to America alone. He has become the cherished possession of the world," he said.

Ryan termed Lincoln an "Indianian" because of the days he spent on Hoosier soil.

At a noon meeting of the Gyro Club Dr. Orin W. Flier, district superintendent of the Methodist Episcopal church, gave an address on "Lincoln." The club will give its annual St. Valentine's dance, Friday night, at Sherman Inn.

Roscoe Kiper, Boonville, new member of the state industrial board, spoke on "Lincoln, the Great American," at a luncheon of Kiwanis Club in the Riley room of the Claypool at noon today. Members of the legislature and Governor Harry G. Leslie were guests of honor invited to attend the luncheon.

Observance of Lincoln day at a meeting tonight of the Marion county committee No. 2 of the National Order of Elphants will be featured by an address by John K. Ruckelshaus.

James M. Ogden, attorney-general, will give a Lincoln address over WFBM at 9:30 p. m. tonight.

INJURED ASK \$40,000 IN TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS

One Sues Street Railway; Another Blames Motorist.

Damages aggregating \$40,000 were asked in two suits filed in superior courts Monday.

Arthur Skidmore, 837 Wright street, sued the Indianapolis Street Railway Company for \$15,000, alleging permanent injuries as a result of an accident Jan. 27 when the auto in which he was riding was struck by a street car at Noble and Ohio streets.

George Hardwick of the Washington hotel, sued M. N. Hindman of Lawrence for \$25,000. Hardwick alleged that Hindman drove his car into Road 67 near Lawrence, without heeding the stop order for the preferential road. Hardwick crashed into Hindman's car and suffered permanent injuries.

INDICT DETECTIVE IN SLEUTH-PAL'S DEATH

Deputy Sheriff Taken to Jail to Await Trial.

PUTNAM, Conn., Feb. 12.—Deputy Sheriff Trener A. Ride of Williamantic was under indictment today for the first degree murder of his former friend and associate in trailing criminals, County Detective William E. Jackson.

The deputy sheriff was back in his cell in county jail at Brooklyn today after a Windham county grand jury had returned a true bill here Monday night.

After receiving the jury's report, Superior Court Judge Newell S. Jennings issued a bench warrant for Rice's arrest. Stoolically, Rice pleaded not guilty in a strong voice and elected trial by jury.

APPROVE NOTE TAX

Committee Passes Levy on Sales Contracts of Corporations.

Approval of the Farrell-Storem bill fixing an annual tax of \$1 a \$100 gross value of conditional sales contracts or business notes of foreign finance companies was voted by the ways and means committee of the Indiana house of representatives today.

The committee decided to return the report this afternoon.

The committee decided also to recommend amendment and passage of the Douglas bill regulating the sale of motor oils and requiring testing of motor oils by the state food and drug commissioner.

Thirty gallons of alcohol were confiscated today by police when they halted a motor car, following a chase, at the corner of Blake and Michigan streets. Three occupants of the auto, one a Negro, escaped. Lieutenant Otto Pettit and Sergeant William Fields said the car's license showed that John Rinman, Plaza hotel, owned it.

ROYSE DEMANDS PAY

Appointee of Collins Sues for Salary.

John A. Royse, appointed by Criminal Judge James A. Collins as

county pauper attorney, Monday afternoon filed a circuit court suit for professional services, in his second legal move to obtain pay for January.

He reiterated the same allegations as were contained in his appeal to the court from the ruling of county commissioners, after they refused to honor his pay request. Royse

was appointed in each pauper case by Collins.

Lloyd D. Claycombe, who was named pauper attorney by commissioners, but who did not take active part in the court, has filed a mandate suit in circuit court demanding County Auditor Harry Dunn pay him on the ground that his appointment is legal and Royse's is not.

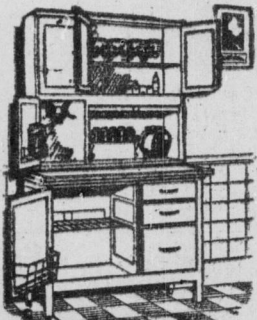

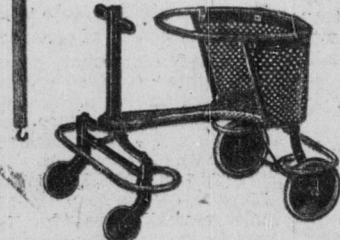

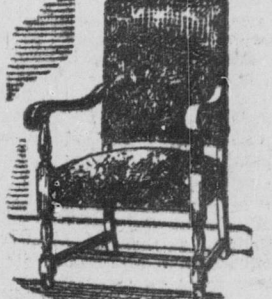
