

**PROPERTY SOLD  
TO ALLISON CO.  
FOR NEW HOME**

Stutz Fire Engine Company  
Site Purchased; Has  
Frontage of 665 Feet.

Officers of the W. D. Allison Company of Indianapolis, manufacturers of physicians' furniture and supplies, who purchased the Stutz Fire Engine Company buildings and real estate, Twenty-third street and the Belt railroad, Thursday, expect to take possession of their new property within two weeks, they announced last year.

**Bought From Sourbier**

The new acquisition in land and buildings was purchased from Edward G. Sourbier, former Marion county treasurer and president of the Central Amusement Company of Indianapolis.

Expansion in business, coupled with the desire of the late W. D. Allison, founder of the company, to obtain additional property resulted in the purchase.

The company's new home was a 665-foot frontage on Twenty-third street and the west property line runs north 397 feet to Burdick parkway. A one-acre tract in the northwest corner of the properties was not included in the sale.

The Stutz Fire Engine Company went into the hands of a receiver in 1927. Sourbier bought the property at a receivership sale. The fire engine company has no connection with the Stutz Motor Car Company.

Although originally manufacturers of fire engines, the company lately has been making only fire engine parts. R. R. Martin is superintendent of the plant.

**Mrs. Allison Is President**

Officers of the Allison company are: Mrs. M. R. Allison, president; W. R. Enoch, vice-president; Mrs. F. Allison Preston, secretary and treasurer; Eli Lilly, vice-president of Eli Lilly & Co., and S. O. Duncan, president of the Polk Sanitary Milk Company, are members of the board of directors.

Ray S. Trent, realty broker, represented the Allison interests and Sourbier in the transaction. The Fletcher American National Bank, trustee of the property for Sourbier, also took part in the negotiations.




