

FIFIELD FRIEND NAMED HEALTH BOARD MEMBER

Dr. John L. Iddings, Lake County, Picked: Eight State Posts Filled.

Selection of Dr. John L. Iddings, Crown Point, as a member of the state board of health, announced in an avalanche of long delayed appointments by Governor Harry G. Leslie late Monday, was seen as a victory for Otto G. Fifield, secretary of state, over the Governor.

Choice of the board of health members rests with the Governor, secretary of state and state auditor, Archie Bobbitt. Term of Dr. James A. Turner, South Bend, expired April 22, and it was announced at that time that he would not succeed himself.

Appointment Delayed

Like other appointments, however, delay was made in naming a successor. Several meetings were held in the Governor's office without agreement being reached.

Fifield, Bobbitt and Leslie all had candidates. The Governor's was said to have been Dr. Harry E. Barnard, Indianapolis, one-time head of the state board of health laboratories. If such was the case, he failed to put him across, and the post goes to a Lake county man, from Fifield's home city.

Mayor W. A. Faust, Elwood, was appointed Democratic member of the state industrial board, to succeed Edgar A. Perkins, Indianapolis, whose retirement is set for June 16. The position pays \$4,000.

Dean John H. Skinner, Purdue university, was named to the deep waterways commission. He succeeds G. I. Christie, former Purdue dean.

Charles M. Snyder, Fowler, was named judge and Robert D. Smalley, Oxford, prosecutor of the newly-created seventy-sixth judicial district in Benton county. Appointments are effective Sept. 1.

Coil Is Reappointed

Dr. H. R. Coil, Ft. Wayne, was reappointed to the state board of registration and examination in optometry. Dr. George L. Frank, Lebanon, was named to succeed Dr. C. D. Adair, Elwood, on the same board. The latter's term expired May 19.

Donald Heaton, Fowler, was named to the engineers' registration board, succeeding A. P. Melton, Gary, whose term expired Feb. 15.

Dr. Iddings, the new board of health member, is former president of the Lake county board of health. He is a graduate of Northwestern university school of medicine and a staff doctor at Mercy hospital, Hammond.

BANKERS PLAN SUIT ON TAXES

Rates in State Too High, Say Financiers.

Indiana Bankers Association, Group Four, in annual session at the Claypool Monday night, avoided the subject of banditry, and devoted most of its time to a subject which it believes also to be a heavy drain on bank profits, taxes.

Friendly litigation to solve the tax problem will be started soon, according to plans outlined by C. Severin Buschman, association attorney. Indiana banks now pay more than any other state, 8.7 per cent taxes on profits, it was said.

To be successful in the suit, it will be necessary to prove that national banks in the state are being discriminated against in favor of other competing money businesses, Attorney Buschman pointed out. In "competing businesses," Buschman included building and loan associations, finance corporations, and mortgage and investment houses, which, he averred, are in competition with banks but enjoy a lighter taxation.

C. A. Overstreet, president of the Franklin National Bank of Franklin, was elected chairman, succeeding Fred M. Martz, cashier of the Arcadia Central Bank. Other officers: M. R. Wilson, cashier of First National Bank, Martinsville, secretary; Arthur Craven, treasurer of the Indiana Trust Company of Indianapolis, alternate to Fred Martz as member of the nominating committee to the state association.
