

BEATS WOMAN TO DEATH WITH LIQUOR BOTTLE

Housekeeper Slain When She Acted 'Peacemaker' in Brawl, Say Cops.

DENVER, June 18.—(Red) Custer was in jail today pending the inquest into the brutal slaying of his housekeeper, Mrs. Bertha Mayfield, 50, whose body was found beneath a pile of telephone poles near his home.

Mrs. Mayfield, police believe, was beaten to death with a quart liquor bottle.

Two blood-stained bottles were found in the kitchen. There were indications of a desperate struggle.

From Custer's rambling statements detectives gathered that Mrs. Mayfield may have been killed when she attempted as peacemaker in a fight between her employer and another man, as yet unidentified.

Police were called to the Custer home when two small boys saw two men carrying a woman's body from the house and attempted to secrete it under the telephone poles.
