

NEW PAVEMENT OPEN; BRIDGES READY FOR USE

Two Detours Lengthened on
State Roads Because
of Construction.

New pavement was opened to use, several bridges completed, and several detours removed during the week, according to the bulletin of the state highway department, issued today.

Director John J. Brown of the department also called attention to lengthening of two detours, made necessary by construction.

A three-and-one-half-mile detour was lifted on 15, between Marion and La Fontaine; new pavement was opened on 24 from two miles east of Peru to Rich Valley; patchwork completed on United States 40, between Cumberland and Greenfield, permitting normal traffic resumption, and a new bridge on 43, west of Chalmers, permitted removal of a four-mile detour.

General road conditions were listed as follows:

Road 3—Detour around bridge construction two miles north of Greensburg and one-half mile south of Sandusky. Detour from Mt. Summit to one mile south of Muncie is sixteen miles. Drive slowly north of Hartford City. Detour from Flat north to Batesville is eight miles. Run-around one-half mile north of Batesville.

Detour of Eighteen Miles

Road 15—Detour from four miles north of Marion to three miles south of Washburn is eighteen miles. Detour from Washburn north three and one-half miles to Batesville is eight miles. Run-around one-half mile north of Batesville.

U. S. Road 24—Detour from Illinois-Indiana line to junction with U. S. 40 and one-half mile. Detour from Goodland to Wolcott is sixteen miles. Pavement from Monticello for fourteen miles east, then detour one-half mile north to old route to Logansport. Use new pavement from two miles east of Peru to Rich Valley, then detour one and one-half miles to old route. Detour from three miles east of Logansport is three miles. Detour east of Huntington until city completes paving to meet state road, is one mile.

Road 29—Detour from Oxford to Junction of 46 and 29 is twenty and three-quarters miles. Grading east of Greensburg. Detour from Greensburg to Shelbyville is twenty-nine miles. Detour from one-half mile south of Boylston to one mile north of Burlington is twenty-two miles. Detour from Winamac to three miles south of Knox is twenty-four miles. Detour from one mile north of La Porte to Michigan City is eight miles.

U. S. Road 31—Detour from seven miles south of Kokomo to Kokomo is eight and one-half miles.

Road 32—Detour four and one-half miles east of Crawfordsville to Shannondale is seven miles.

Road 34—Detour in Crawfordsville is one and one-half miles. Detour west of New Ross is one mile.

Road 35—Detour in Rockville. Five-ton load limit of temporary bridge.

Road 37—Detour from four miles south

of Bloomington to Bedford is twenty-eight and one-half miles. Good surface, but narrow, and has many sharp turns.

Road 43—Detour from one mile north of Cloverdale to 40 is nine miles. Detour from one mile north of Brookston to one mile south of Chalmers is eight miles. Bridge run-around two miles north of Francesville. Drive slowly for next few days while road is oiled between White-Pulaski county line and San Pierre.

U. S. Road 52—Detour from eight miles west of Metamora to Brookville is eighteen and one-half miles. Part of detour over No. 1. Through traffic follow No. 1 to Connersville then No. 44 to Rushville.

Road 56—Detour from Princeton to Oakland City is fifteen miles. Detour from Jasper to a point east of Haystack is seven miles and poor, three miles of which is earth. Heavy traffic avoid bridge run-around two miles east of Salem. Detour between Scottsburg and Blocher is ten miles; many sharp turns. Detour around earth slide two miles west of Vevay is two and one-half miles and only fair.

Roads not mentioned, and parts of roads mentioned, but not specified, and all detours not otherwise described, are in good condition.

DELUGE BURIES \$13,000 GIRDER

57-Ton Steel Bar Found
Submerged in Mud.

BUTTE, Mont., Aug. 9.—Northern Pacific railway engineers, digging in the mud of a usually dry creekbed in eastern Montana, unearthed a treasure of \$13,265.

Several weeks ago, a cloudburst swept down a dry creekbed 10 miles west of Glendive, forcing a 24-foot channel on its route, and carrying away a Northern Pacific bridge.

When crews hastily constructed a temporary trestle, they discovered that an 87-foot 57-ton steel girder had completely disappeared.

The creek was searched, but the flood had evidently carried the huge girder to a perfect place of concealment.

Several days ago, engineers were examining the hard-baked mud surface of the creek and saw the rough outline of the missing girder, 230 feet below the bridge site. It was two feet below the surface of the mud completely buried.

The girder represented a cost of \$13,265.

This total is divided as follows: Physicians, \$745,000,000; quacks, \$120,000,000; dispensaries, \$2,333,824; hospitals, \$404,501,572; nursing, \$151,900,000; medical supplies, \$700,000,000; dental, \$285,000,000; loss of wages, \$1,245,000,000; prevention of illness, \$72,290,000.

In addition, Dr. Folks estimates loss of wages due to premature death caused by illness at \$12,000,000,000 annually.
