

## ORDER TAKES RIFLES FROM DRY OFFICERS

Offensive Weapon Can Be  
Used Only in Isolated  
Regions, Says Doran.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 9.—J. M. Doran, prohibition commissioner, today drafted an order to dry administrators forbidding carrying of rifles by prohibition agents except when they work in isolated sections. The new regulation was adopted after a Texan had been killed accidentally by dry agents.

Hereafter, agents will be armed only with revolvers, as a previous order by Doran banned the carrying of sawed-off shotguns and similar weapons. Doran said prohibiting the carrying of rifles would aid in the campaign to reduce fatal shootings by dry officers, as they now are armed only for self-protection and to prevent the committing of a felony.

"There appears to be no necessity for prohibition agents to carry rifles when working in settled communities," Doran said. "The rifle essentially is an offensive weapon and the prohibition service does not bear arms for offensive purposes. In communities pistols must be used exclusively, as agents are armed only to defend their lives."

"However, in mountain country or on the little-settled plains where long-range defense of an agent's life may be necessary, rifles will be permitted. Frequently, in mountain moonshine raids, officers are sniped at over ranges of 300 yards. The same conditions probably would obtain on the open plains."

The new order was promulgated following the killing of Tom Chandler of Potet, Tex., by agent Charles Stevens. Doran said reports in this case showed Stevens fell and the rifle he carried accidentally was discharged, causing the death of the farmer.

### THREE DIE IN AIR CRASH
