

FLYING SCHOOL TUTORS PILOTS OF ALL TYPES

Real Aviation University on
Pacific Coast Is
Expensive.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20.—A real University of the Air, which puts out a regular college catalog, makes you attend classes daily, and gives you a diploma when you are graduated, has been opened at Oakland, Cal. It is the much-discussed Boeing School of Aeronautics. You can go to school there and learn how to be everything from a mechanic to a master pilot, ready for the air mail or passenger lines.

A look at the school's tuition schedule shows you can't learn to fly on a shoe-string. At the Boeing school it will cost you \$490 to get a private pilot's license; \$1,450 for a limited commercial license; \$4,750 for a transport license; and \$5,250 for a Boeing master pilot's certificate.

In addition to this, you must live while learning. With the living accommodations which the Boeing school has arranged, it is possible that a student might eat, sleep and smoke during his nine months' schooling for \$750. Thus a master pilot's course would cost \$6,000, at least.

All the Boeing courses include plenty of ground school and flying instruction can not be taken without ground work. In the private license course, thirty-five hours of classroom work are given. In the master pilot's course the ground school is 864 hours, and in the master mechanics course it is 1,008 hours.

The school is located on the Oak-land municipal airport. It has a dozen classroom instructors, and is presided over by a general manager, a dean, and a director of flying. Boeing, Stearman and Hamilton planes are used for instruction.

The master pilot's course was developed to provide air transport companies with trained and amply educated men who need but little additional seasoning to qualify them as mail and passenger pilots.

This course started Sept. 16 and lasts nine months, just as any other college course. The other courses take from two to six months.

RAILS OPEN GRAIN AREA

First Wheat Shipped to England by
Hudson Bay Company.

OTTAWA, Ontario, Sept. 20.—Consigned by the Hudson Bay Company, the first shipment of wheat to be exported to England via Ft. Churchill and the new Hudson Bay railway, has gone forward. Consisting of one ton of No. 1 hard Manitoba wheat done up in two-pound sacks, the significance of the shipment lies in its historic interest to the company which started trading through Hudson Bay in the year 1670.

The bags will be distributed in England as souvenirs of the opening of the historic northern route by railway and steamship. They go forward to Churchill on the first work train to go over a regular ballasted track.

PRE-COLUMBUS CONTACTS WITH AMERICA SEEN

Pan-Pacific Relationship
Due to Trading is
Scientist's Theory.

MEXICO CITY, Sept. 20.—That America had commercial relationship with the Polynesian islands before Columbus discovered America, is the theory of Dr. Paul Rivet, anthropologist and director of the Trocadero museum in Paris, now in the National university at Mexico City as exchange professor.

A study of names of certain common objects and basic agricultural products show linguistic coincidences between Peru and Oceania.

These are due, Dr. Rivet believes, not to a common tongue far in the background, but to a transmission of names, along with the products, from one continent to another.

Other evidence also points to relationships between the Pacific islands and prehistoric America, such as folk legends and the finding of objects of undoubted Polynesian

origin in America, reported at different times.

It always has been considered that the Pacific ocean was impossible to cross until recent times. This belief has kept the theory of pan-Pacific relationships from being more widely adopted by ethnologists and geographers. Dr. Rivet said. Recent studies of mankind's seagoing history have, however, convinced him that the theory is not improbable.

The simplest form of primitive raft or boat gave man an advantageous means of transportation, such as he did not evolve on land until much later. The tropical Pacific generally is calm, and historical and archeological evidence indicate that the west coast of

South America was a great maritime region. The Peruvian art of working metals thus was transmitted from South America to Mexico.

Many South American legends and traditions tell of the arrival of strangers from unknown lands, and among the Indians of the Pacific coast there were tales at the time of the conquest of lands across the Pacific. A Peruvian legend tells of the arrival of a race of giants from the west who came in boats of wood and cane fitted with triangular sails, who landed at Point Santa Elena.

While Dr. Rivet believes these legends undoubtedly were influenced by the discovery of large animal

bones which originally were thought to be human, they nevertheless have a foundation of truth in the arrival of strangers from the west. There also exist tales of the invasion of Chile by pirates from the East Indian islands, and there is a reference to Oceanic Negroes on the coast of Peru.




