

LOBBY PROBE IS MENACE TO TARIFF ACTION

Committee From Senate to
Inquire Into Pressure
for Protection.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 9.—Passage of the tariff bill, either during the extra session of congress, which still has six weeks to run, or during the regular session which will follow, became more uncertain today as the measure faced the threat of the senate lobby investigation.

The five senators named to conduct the inquiry will meet within a few days to plan their hearings, which Senator Caraway of Arkansas said will begin next week. The committee's first attention will be given to the tariff lobbies, which have maintained headquarters in Washington.

The sub-committee, appointed by Senator George W. Norris of Nebraska, chairman of the judiciary committee, contains four senators who are avowed opponents of the measure now before the senate and only one champion of the bill. Senator Robinson of Indiana is the only conservative Republican on the committee.

His associates, aside from Caraway, who sponsored the resolution which forced the probe, included Borah of Idaho, Walsh of Montana and Blaine of Wisconsin, all identified with the progressive Republican-Democratic coalition, which is fighting the bill.

Joseph R. Grundy of Philadelphia, head of the Pennsylvania Manufacturers' Association, probably will be the first witness summoned. The committee now is gathering data on Grundy's activities.

Senator Caraway today received his first avowal of willingness to testify. The Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, which informs congress of its peace efforts, urged that registration of lobbyists and lobbying funds be required. The league expressed the hope the investigation will result in constructive regulatory legislation.


