

ARMISTICE DAY COMMITTEE TO MEET TONIGHT

Parade Will Be Limited to 5,000 Marchers, With Few Automobiles.

Final arrangements for the Armistice day parade will be considered at 7:30 tonight at the Chamber of Commerce by the general committee, composed of representatives of various civic, fraternal, and patriotic organizations.

The meeting was called by Colonel A. J. Dougherty, parade marshal. B. W. Bradlow is general chairman and Colonel Bowman Elder will be chief aide to Dougherty.

The parade has been limited tentatively to 5,000 marchers. In addition, there will be several floats. William Fortune, as president of the American Peace society, will give a short address at the Soldiers and Sailors monument. In addition, it is planned to select a leading Catholic and Jewish speaker for the program.

The legion executive committee, which started plans for the parade, recently voted to place marchers representing the Veterans of Foreign Wars in line ahead of legionnaires, as a gesture of friendship.

The tentative lineup includes: G. A. R. and affiliated bodies, such as the United Confederate Veterans. United Spanish War Veterans and auxiliary, Overseas League, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Rainbow division, legion national headquarters group, departmental group, Red Cross nurses, Seventh district headquarters.

The Indianapolis Merchants Association and the Associated Employers of Indianapolis have promised to release employees to march with various organizations. Superintendent Charles F. Miller will dismiss high school pupils for the parade.


