

EXPANSION IS PROMISED BY R. R. LEADERS

Billion-Dollar Budget Is Pledged by Executives at Chicago Meeting.

CHICAGO, Nov. 22.—A \$1,000,000 budget, in terms of rails, rolling stock, new terminal facilities and other improvements, took form today as executives of America's railroads pledged an unparalleled program of expansion to re-structure business to prosperity pitch.

Prospects were that the transportation leaders would decide to open rail purses even wider than was suggested by President Hoover in his recent conference with them at Washington, and that far-reaching plans for consolidations would be forthcoming.

Names listed on the roster at the Blackstone hotel, where the Association of Railway Executives is meeting, include those of most of the important executives in the American railroad world.

Among them were J. J. Bernet, president of the Chesapeake & Ohio; Carl Gray, president of the Union Pacific; H. A. Scandrett, president of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul & Pacific; P. E. Crowley, president of the New York Central; James E. Gorman, president of the Rock Island; W. B. Storey, president of the Santa Fe; Elisha Lee, vice-president of the Pennsylvania; L. A. Downs, president of the Illinois Central.

Probability of railroad consolidation projects assuming definite proportions after the first of the year was seen by President Bernet of the C. & O.

"We are assured," he said, "that the interstate commerce commission will have before it, by the first of the year, a plan of railroad consolidation. A great deal depends upon the roads that have consolidation ambitions knowing what they are going to be able to do. Adoption of a workable plan would result in large expenditures."

CO-EDS EXCEL MEN IN GRADES AT I. U.

Beta Sigma Omicron Sorority Members Lead in Scholarship.

BLOOMINGTON, Ind., Nov. 22.—The scholastic standing of organizations of Indiana University of the second semester of last year announced at the office of the dean of women shows that Beta Sigma Omicron sorority leads the list, with an average of 1,935 credit points. The rating is made on a basis of credit points per credit hour. A grade of A carried three credit points an hour, a B two credits, and C one. The average of all men and women was 1,549, which is slightly higher than that of the first semester.

Women students ranked higher academically than did men. The average of all women students was 1,713, and of men, 1,386. In organization standing, students of the east wing of Memorial Hall, women's dormitory, ranked second, and the Delta Phi Sigma fraternity came third and highest among men's groups.

The average of all unorganized women for the second semester of last year was 1,751, and that of sorority women 1,680. The average of fraternity men was 1,3912 and unorganized men 1,3784.



