

BODIES OF FIVE ARE RECOVERED IN STORE RUINS

Elame Boiler Safety Valve for Blast Injuring 30 Persons.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22.—Five persons were dead today and more than thirty others injured, three critically, as a result of the boiler explosion which wrecked the front of McCrory five-and-ten cent store here Thursday.

The blast, coming at the height of the afternoon shopping period, hurled men and women in all directions and carried many to the basement of the store when the sidewalk in front of the building collapsed.

DOCTOR AMAZES WITH OPERATION

Restores Sight by Removal of Brain Tumor.

OKLAHOMA CITY, Nov. 22.—Twenty surgeons thronged around Dr. E. R. Carpenter of Dallas, Tex., Thursday as with deft strokes he performed what was described as one of the most precarious brain operations ever attempted.

For six hours, Dr. Carpenter worked over Steven L. Lucas, 38, who had lost his eyesight because of a brain tumor which slowly was taking his life. A section of the skull, two by three inches, was removed. The tumor was as large as a child's fist.

Two relatives of the patient were

nearby and during those hours gave forty ounces of blood to sustain the man. The entire operation was done with only local anesthetics. None of the witnessing doctors left the room until the operation was complete. Expressions of admiration burst from them as Lucas was wheeled away.

Thursday night the patient was regaining his sight, lost a month ago. He will recover completely, it was said at the hospital.




