

# FILIPINO PLEA IS LINKED WITH NAVAL PARLEY

Drive for Independence Will Be Timed to Coincide With Conference.

This is the fourteenth of a series of articles on the coming five-power naval parley in London, written by an expert on international affairs.

The most determined drive for independence yet launched by the Filipinos is being timed to coincide with the London naval conference and the preparations therefor. Manuel Quezon, president of the Philippines senate; Speaker Roxas of the lower house, and a representative group of Filipino leaders, are due to sail for Washington, Dec. 7. Therefore they will be ready for action when congress resumes its sessions after the Christmas holidays.

Primarily, the new fight for independence comes as a sequel to the recent senate vote on the tariff bill amendment of Senator King of Utah, having to do with freedom for the Philippines.

It was defeated by only a narrow margin, and some who voted against it explained that they did so only because they objected to an issue of such importance being decided in that way.

Another Chance Given  
But the naval limitation conference will give the Filipinos still another lever to work with. It is a matter of common knowledge that the islands are even now at the mercy of at least one far eastern power, and naturally any further weakening of the United States navy would tend to make their capture all the more easy.

Insecurity of the Philippines already was a matter of moment in this country when the first five-power naval conference met in Washington in 1921. But whatever plans the United States may have had at that time for strengthening them went glimmering with the signing of the Washington treaty, since it is pledged us not to carry the work of fortifying the Philippines, Guam and Samoa any further.

This left a pretty one-sided situation in the western Pacific. Japan, of course, is situated in that region and quite naturally is well provided with all the naval bases she needs. If not, she can build more. And though Great Britain is bound by the same treaty not to fortify Hongkong any further, Singapore, in easy striking distance of the Philippines, is exempt and is being made into a second Gibraltar.

U. S. Has Feeble Defense  
So, at Cavite, on Manila bay, the United States has its only naval base, even half way worthy of the name, west of Pearl harbor, in the Hawaiian islands, 4,800 miles eastward across the Pacific.

Defended by twelve-inch guns, the battleships of both Britain and Japan can outshoot it any day in the year, and its lone drydock, the ancient Dewey, can not accommodate any vessel larger than 15,000 tons. Our battleships range from 20,000 to 35,000 tons.

It is an open secret that Japan could take the Philippines any time she wants to. It is even said that the United States would abandon all attempt to defend the islands from the sea, the conditions being too unfavorable.

Such being the broad facts in the case, it is clear that the future status of the Philippines must be a factor in any naval limitation agreement into which the United States may enter.

True, a four-power pact was signed by America, Britain, Japan and France at the Washington conference guaranteeing the status quo in the Pacific, but up to now it has not prevented large fleets being maintained in that ocean.

For many Filipinos, and no small number of Americans, the answer is Philippine independence. Proponents are suggesting that the United States free the Filipino and at the same time induce the other great powers to sign a treaty formally guaranteeing not to infringe upon this freedom.

Heretofore one of the arguments most frequently advanced by opponents of Philippine independence has been the islands' need of American protection. The admission of naval men that America is not now in a position to guarantee such protection doubtless will constitute part of the case presented by the new independence mission on the eve of departure for this country.

## 23 COMPANIES SUE TO ENJOIN COAL NAME USE

Charge City Dealers, Firms Sell Inferior Product as Pocahontas.

Seventeen coal dealers and firms were named defendants in a suit filed today in federal court to enjoin use of the trade-name Pocahontas.

Twenty-three companies producing Pocahontas coal joined as plaintiffs in the suit for a permanent injunction to prevent the use of such trade names as "Wonder-Pocahontas," "Banner-Pocahontas" and "Semi-Pocahontas" coal. Frederick Van Nuy, former United States district attorney, represented the plaintiffs. The defendants have twenty days in which to file an answer before Federal Judge Robert C. Baltzell.

\$500,000 in Damage  
It is understood that testimony will be introduced to recover damages ranging from \$300,000 to \$500,000 for use of the name Pocahontas. The suit charged that the dealers had sold an inferior grade of coal, representing it to be Pocahontas.

The suit defines Pocahontas coal as "semi-bituminous low volatile, smokeless coal" produced exclusively in certain territory including McDowell, Mercer and Wyoming counties, West Virginia and Tazewell county, Virginia.

"We are informed reliably that there are a few dealers here who will deliver any kind of coal desired from the same bin," declared W. E. E. Koepfer, speaking for the producers who are seeking to prevent allegedly fraudulent use of the trade-name. "They are not miracle workers," he added.

Conditions Here Bad  
"I never saw conditions as bad as they are here. Your local government authorities doubtless will continue their earnest effort to clean up certain intolerable conditions," Koepfer scored the resort to technicalities to evade the city coal ordinance and urged its revision.
