

FRENCH HURL WAR CHARGES AT GERMANY

Deputies Claim Preparations Being Made for Great Chemical Struggle.

PARIS, Dec. 10.—Charges that Germany has been preparing for "the most formidable chemical war and today constitutes the gravest danger to peace," were made by French deputies today during a discussion of the war budget in the chamber.

Henri Franklin-Bouillon led the attack, asserting that he was "raising a cry of alarm" only because he had received many letters from German pacifists detailing Germany's alleged militaristic preparations.

Other deputies described the German "chauvinistic mentality" as unchanged since Versailles, declaring that Germany has not disarmed and, as before, she wishes to remain a great power, making treaties which she later can break, to retake her place in the sun.

Pierre Cot said France had dictated the terms of the Versailles treaty, yet she still was forced to spend heavily on her military budget to feel secure.

BRIDGE CONTRACT LET

Bid of \$447,000 Wins Award of Work on Super-Structure.

Board of works today approved the granting of the contract for the super-structure of the Indianapolis Union Belt Railroad bridge over White river to the American Bridge Company on a bid of \$447,000.

The contract has to be submitted to the railway again for final approval before being begun. The bid was \$9,000 higher than a joint bid, but Theodore Dammeier, works board president, and City Engineer A. H. Moore decided that all the work should be done by the same contractor.

The project will be completed in about a year. Total cost of the bridge will be about \$1,200,000, of which the railroad will pay 50 per cent, the city 34 and the county 16 per cent.

FARMER KILLS SELF

Mortgage Foreclosure Precedes Death in Family's Presence.

KENDALLVILLE, Ind., Dec. 10.—William Strouse, 42-year-old farmer, watched creditors remove mortgaged livestock and machinery from his farm Monday night. For years he had been struggling to stave off the inevitable day.

This morning Strouse awoke and gazed upon his completed properties. Suddenly he turned to his wife and four children.

"I can't stand it!" he shrieked. "I'm going to end it all!" Strouse sent a .32-caliber rifle bullet through his head in the presence of his family, and dropped dead.

SEEK TO CUT TRAINS

Railroad Asks to Discontinue Two Vincennes-Bicknell Trips.

Discontinuance of two trains operating between Vincennes and Bicknell is asked by the Pennsylvania railroad in a petition filed with the public service commission.

The trains were used solely for the transportation of miners between the cities, and since the closing of the mines business has fallen off to such extent that the company is losing approximately \$1,000 a month in the operation of the trains, the petition avers.

De Witt Parker Is Ordered Removed to This City for Quiz.

De Witt Parker, alias Woodrow Anderson, wanted here by federal and state authorities for alleged conspiracy in connection with the Pettis Dry Goods Company robbery several months ago, has been ordered removed here from Toledo, O., where he was arrested with three other men.

Officials charge Parker was one of a group which planned to rob the store, but which was foiled when an alleged conspirator went to Chicago and recruited several bandits who robbed the store of company and postoffice funds before the appointed date.

All three others arrested with Parker are believed to live in Indianapolis, although giving other addresses. Rifles, revolvers, and safe-blowing tools were found in their possession, police say.

Cecil Albert Johnson is wanted in Louisville and Dayton on burglary charges, William C. Ela, postal inspector, said. Wilbur Ferguson and George Lewis Johnson are being held in the Toledo workhouse while their records are being investigated.

BOMB FOUND IN BROKER'S HOME; GUARD MANSION

Butler Finds Explosive as Guests Sit Down for Dinner; Fuse Out.

CHICAGO, Dec. 10.—Discovery of a dynamite bomb in the dining room of the Lake Forest mansion of James Norris, wealthy broker, with connections here and in New York, just as he and several guests were about to sit down to dinner, has led to a guard of five private detectives armed with shotguns patrolling the estate today.

Police guards were protecting Norris, who owns the controlling interest in the \$7,000,000 Chicago stadium, and Sidney N. Strotz, also a wealthy broker and heir to the fortune of the late C. N. Strotz.

A butler discovered the bomb on a window sill. The fuse had burned half way along and gone out. The men took the explosive, which police said would have killed every one in the room and wrecked the house, out of the room without saying anything to their wives.

Norris telephoned for police aid and the heavy guard was posted. Police also guarded the stadium today, on the theory the plot grew out of Norris' connection with the big west side structure. A bitter struggle for control of the stadium resulted in the ouster of Patrick T. (Paddy) Harmon as manager recently.

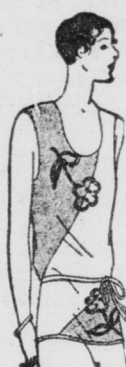
