

TWO STORES, HOME ROBBED; TAXI IS TAKEN

Negroes Steal Cab; Auto Recovered; Foil Purse-Snatcher.

Holdup of a taxi driver, burglaries of two stores and a home and attempted purse snatching was Indianapolis' crime record for Thursday night.

Frank Judd, 21, of 407 East Ohio street, taxi driver, was held up and robbed by two Negro passengers at Northwestern avenue and Fall Creek, the bandits getting \$5 cash and taking his cab, which later was recovered. Judd was held up and robbed Tuesday night by two white men.

Burglars at the Jerry Benedict grocery, 1014 West Vermont street, got \$15 worth of foodstuffs and tobacco. Two residents nearby were taken to police they saw two men in the store.

A dozen pedestrians saw a burglar break glass out of a front door of the Chris Shishoff soft drink parlor at 843 East Washington street. The burglar carried a slot machine away. Shishoff, awakened by the breaking glass, was afraid to go downstairs to interrupt the burglar, he told police.

Mrs. Laura Snyder of 1941 Bellefontaine street, threw a jaw of mustard and struck a Negro who attempted to snatch her purse at Twentieth and Bellefontaine streets and the man fled.

Two Negroes suspected in recent filling station holdups are held by police under high bonds.

Mrs. Gladys Williams, 720 North Senate avenue, reported clothing and other articles valued at \$104 stolen from her home.

Mrs. Mary Roe, 519 Miami street, reported she fired one shot at a prowler who attempted to force open a back door of her home and that the man fled. The bullet lodged in an ice box next door.

DRIVING ADVICE GIVEN

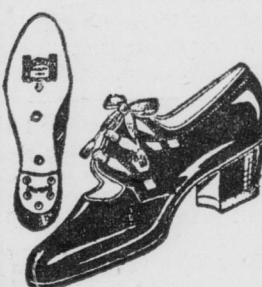
