

WIDE LATITUDE TO BE GIVEN IN NAVAL PARLEY

Delegates to Be Allowed
Great Liberty in
Discussions.

LONDON, Dec. 18.—Delegates to the forthcoming five-power naval conference here will have the widest latitude in discussing reduction, and the limits of naval strength assigned to the various powers will be determined by the conference itself rather than in the conversations now taking place in European and American capitals.

That was made plain today when it was learned that the powers have received from London a general outline of the conference program, without any actual agenda, as in previous conferences.

The outline comprises a few general remarks explaining the purpose of the meeting and the formula for the basis of discussion. It emphasizes that thorough preparation for the discussions has been made through preliminary conversations, but leaves the various delegations the widest possible liberty of discussion. The figures under the ratios must be decided within the conference itself.

Political observers recall that the Geneva conference of 1927 failed chiefly because it lacked the spirit of understanding, and became deadlocked when no delegation was inclined to accept the viewpoint of any other group.

NAMED FORDSON DEALER

The new tractors have been improved, horse power being increased 27.5 per cent, developing 30-horse power at 2 1/2 miles an hour plowing speed.

OCEAN FLIERS RESTING AFTER FOREST CRASH

Head Winds Reduced Fuel,
Forcing Aviators to For-
tunate Wreck.

NATAL, Brazil, Dec. 18.—Two tired and shaken trans-Atlantic airmen, one recovering in a hospital from injuries, the other resting at a Santo Antonio home, supplanted with graphic detail today the hours of silence which had enveloped their flight from Seville, Spain. To a fortunate yet nearly fatal crash in the edge of Brazil's forests, forty-two hours later.

Lieutenant-Colonel Tadeo Larre Borges, the Uruguayan, rested at Santo Antonio, from the strain and shock of the second air accident which has marked his attempts to link his native land with the Spanish motherland.

In a hospital here, sixty-five miles from the forest section of Maracuja, where the white trans-Atlantic bi-plane splintered into a crushed eggshell Tuesday, Captain Leon Challe, Larre Borges' French companion, belittled the serious gash above his eye and the body bruises which he suffered. He chose to thank fortune for directing them through the dense fog to a landing from which they survived. "Everything had gone well," Challe said. "Our motor was functioning perfectly throughout. We had hoped to swing down the coast,

but encountered storms which slowed us up, reducing our fuel and finally forced us down.

"We just ran out of gas and, therefore, couldn't fly any more."
