

## FOUR ARE HURT IN CITY FROM AUTO MISHAPS

Woman May Have Suffered Fracture of Skull in Being Run Down.

Automobile accidents which police blamed on icy streets injured four persons and damaged several automobiles Wednesday night and today.

Claude Shepherd, 28, of 2020 North Pennsylvania street, was injured when a milk wagon he was driving was struck by a Central avenue street car at Pennsylvania and Thirty-sixth streets.

Crossing the National road, near Ben Davis, to accept a "lift" from a motorist, Tom Hallan, 50, St. Louis, stepped into the path of an automobile driven by E. A. Mitchell, Clayton, early today.

Mitchell swerved into a ditch, trying to avoid Hallan, who was knocked down, and suffered scalp and leg injuries.

Mrs. Anna Reynolds, 39, of 1217 Vandeman street, was injured critically Wednesday night when struck by an automobile driven by Everett Wilson, 25, of 1226 Hoogen street, in the 1300 block on Shelby street.

City hospital physicians say her skull may be fractured.

Mrs. Verna Brennon, 710 Laverock road, was slightly injured in an automobile collision Wednesday at Forty-ninth street and College avenue.

Two automobiles and an interurban car were damaged badly in a three-way accident at 3200 West Washington street Wednesday night, but none was injured.

A T. H. I. & E. traction car, in charge of Roy Middleton of 541 North Bosart avenue, motorman, jumped the track and struck a street railway company bus driven by Ray Hutchinson of 1531 Montcalm street, wrecking the bus and damaging the traction car.

While police investigated the accident an automobile driven by Harry Emery of 3730 Creston street, hit the rear end of the wrecked interurban and was badly damaged.

pany, Wilmington, Del., against the White Star Motor Oil Company, Franklin, charging infringement of the "White Star" trade-mark.




