

BORAH READY TO CUT LOOSE ON DRY CHIEFS

Idaho Senator Bolsters
Mass of Explosive
Evidence.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24.—An explosive mine of material, concerning prohibition enforcement laxities and alleged frauds, is being hidden away in the private files of Senator William E. Borah of Idaho, the constitutional dry leader, who charged the enforcement personnel was bad "from top to bottom."

Since he made the charge, during the Christmas holidays, Borah has received numberless sensation tales, charges, and affidavits from persons throughout the country, who claim to have personal information.

Even before he made the charge, Borah obtained evidence concerning seventeen district attorneys throughout the country and now he has bolstered this information with more material than he has been able to digest.

While he has declined to comment upon any of it or to reveal any of his facts, it is expected Borah will use this information from the floor of the senate as soon as the tariff bill is completed, probably within two weeks. His intention will be to force removal of some of the present dry officials, his friends have indicated.

A mass meeting will be held in the afternoon at Roberts Park Methodist church, with individual meetings and addresses throughout the day in other Methodist churches of the city.


The meeting is one of a series scheduled throughout the month of February for the southern Illinois and Indiana conferences.

WOMEN VOTERS IN ANTI-COFFIN MOVE

Organization of a Republican League of women voters whose object it will be to eradicate traces of Coffinism in city and county government has been undertaken, it was learned today.

Names of several prominent business men, politicians and former city employees were on the list. It was reported to the safety board that some of the badges had been seen "underworld characters."


Myers said that the board had a record of every badge by number and a careful check will be made to determine those missing.


