

G. O. P. TICKET GIVEN PRAISE

Speakers Plead Interests of Entire State.

"Support the President by electing a Republican representative, Republican county and township officials and Republican candidates for state senator and representatives" was the plea of organization speakers Monday night at a series of meetings.

Archibald Hall, candidate for Seventh district congressman praised the qualification of his running mates on the county ticket and urged their election.

Pointing out that two years ago, this county cast an overwhelming vote for Hoover, Hall asked that they return a Republican to support the president. It was in this same election that Marion county elected Louis Ludlow, Democrat to congress.

Plea for election of a Republican legislative delegation was made over station WKBF by Linton A. Cox, candidate for state senator. He called attention to the reapportionment question which will arise at the next session and intimated that if a Republican majority is elected, the reapportionment of the Marion county candidates should be effected.
